



France Needs Help From Canada

The prospect of another and more desperate winter in France this year, and the mounting need of clothing and medical supplies of the destitute peoples of the country, have resulted in a renewed effort by Canadians throughout the Dominion to effect some relief through numerous and generous donations to the Canada-France movement.

With the co-operation of the Commercial Travelers Association, over 5000 bundles of clothing and medical supplies were collected in a single day in the Quebec City area, and this fall, bundles shipped from Quebec to France, through the Red Cross and via Britain, filled over 150 cars.

Activities of the Canada-France Relations Committee are co-ordinated and correlated with those of UNRRA, and the Red Cross. Headquarters are located at 237 St. James Street West, Montreal, and 149 St. Joseph Street, Quebec City.

When is it time to call quits?

On a soft, spring night in April, 1944, P/O J. L. Webb, Hamilton, Ontario, was set to fly his first sortie as captain of an aircraft destined to bomb Montzen. Crossing the enemy coast, the aircraft was hit by anti-aircraft fire, tearing several big holes in the fuselage. P/O Webb flew on to Belgium in his crippled craft, as scheduled.

In the bombing run over the target, it became apparent that the hydraulic system had been damaged. The bomb doors could not be opened. P/O Webb made another circuit of the target, while his engineer struggled to open the bomb bay doors by hand.

On the second run in, the aircraft was attacked by a fighter. This was beaten off, and the bombs were released on Montzen. Coming up from the target, three more fighters closed in on the damaged aircraft. Two fighters were successfully evaded, but while fighting the third, P/O Webb's aircraft was riddled by enemy bullets. One engine was destroyed. The port aileron and mainplane were damaged.

With controls severely damaged, P/O Webb flew back to Britain, landing with only two engines but bringing his aircraft and his crew to safety. Because of "superb skill and exceptional devotion to duty in the face of heavy odds", P/O Webb received the D.S.O.
