THE AIRSHIP.

For I dived into the future far as human eye could see Saw the vision of the world, and all the wonders that should be; Saw the Heavens filled with commerce, argosies of malice sails, Pilots of the purple twilight dropping down with costly bales; Heard the Heavens filled with shouting and there rained a ghastly dew From the nations' airy navies grappling in the central blue.

The true poet is the prophet of his age, and who shall say that the better part of Tennyson's vision may not yet be realized, perhaps in the near future? The account of the recent successful experiments of Santos-Dumont at Paris give renewed hopes. From the immemorial past man has envied the birds their power of flight; longed to soar aloft like the eagle; sighed for the wings of the dove that he might fly away and be at rest. But the secret of the power of flight has been jealously guarded. No bird of the air has disclosed the mystery of his great superiority in this ocean of water covers nearly three quarters of the earth's surface. The atmosphere is a greater, rarer, deeper ocean, which embraces the entire globe. Man has mastered the watery waves, by oar and sail and steam. He has banded the earth with roads of steel, and covered it with electric wires along which the very lightning of the heavens is made to carry his thought across the continents and beneath the seas. But like another Alexander he has wept to think of a world while he could not conquer. He has been forced to walk along the bottom of the great atmospheric ocean, while longing to rise upward into its midst. For the air is, in sooth, his native element.

Herein he touches the mystery of mysteries. The ocean of water upon which he has performed such prodigies is fatal to life. If man sinks beneath it he perishes. But the upper ocean is to him the breath of life. His conscious separate existence began when first he inhaled its essence, and his earthly career is ended with his last expiring breath. Into that upper realm departs his spirit, his essence, the condensation and enduring self, whose very name of spirit is derived from air. How natural then is the desire, the aspiration, which pet in the body, to rise and soar in the greater ocean of life; to float with the fleecy cloud in the open firmament of heaven; to rise even above the clouds and bask in the unsullied and perpetual sunlight; to rise like the lark and greet the sun while yet his beams are invisible below; to watch from some far height the glory of the parting day.

So we must rejoice in the discovery, the skill of Santos-Dumont, and the mechanism which his inventive brain has evolved. It means an enormous and inconceivable enlargement of the dominion of man; a fulfilment of the primal promise of lordship over earth and sea and air. It means a multiplication of his powers, privileges and enjoyments, the striking off of a fetter which has galled the race for ages. It means a liberty unknown before; that man shall be free as the air he breathes. The man of the nineteenth century, rejoiced in the new powers given him by the agency of steam and electricity. The man of the twentieth century will have wings; will sail amid the cloud islands of the upper sea; will soar above the ocean and the land. Above the track of migratory birds his ships will "pass in the night and speak each other in passing."

Pass by for the moment the "argosies of magic sails" banish from the imagination all thought of the "navies in grappling in the central blue." We can think of no such possibility as war in that upper and better realm. But think of

the pleasures of an excursion upward during the heated term of summer! The too great heat belongs solely to the lower stratum of air, the bottom of the atmospheric sea. High aloft it is always cool. We may soar to the region of the snow line if we will. Above the din, the dust, the heat and turmoil of the world below, in the pure air, with far prospect over land and sea—what could be more delightful! The one saddening reflection would be that we must descend to earth again.

Of course it will take time to overcome the known and unknown difficulties, to perfect the machinery and appliances, to guard against the new dangers. All this will yet be done. The mere balloon, sailcraft of the air, will give place to the aeromotor of the steamship of the skies and man will fly upon the wings of the wind above the earth.

A SECOND DEAD SEA.

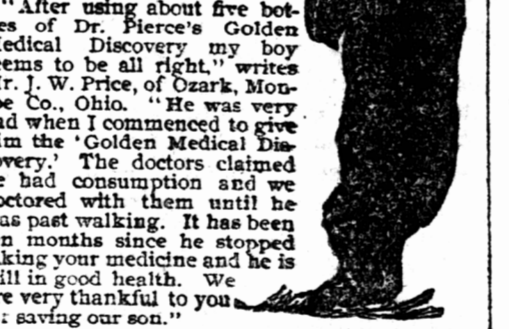
JAPANESE DYING OF FEVER.

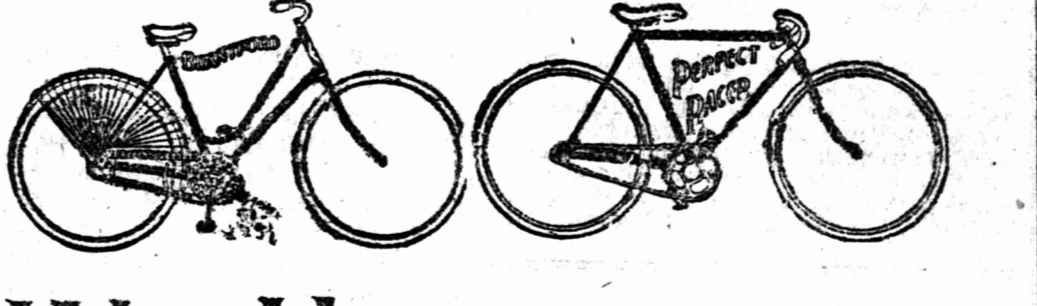

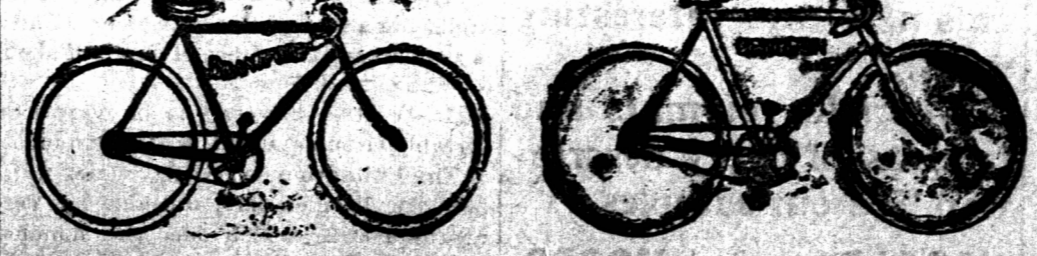
