## Argonauts Defeat Blue Bombers 28-6 To Retain Dominion Football Title

TORONTO, Dec. 1.—(CP)—On a peerless aerial attack piloted by Joe (King) Krol, the champion Toronto Argonauts swept to a 28-6 victory here Saturday to turn back the challenge of Winnipeg Blue Bombers to their Dominion football crown for the second straight year.

For a sell-out crowd of 19,000 packing Varsity Stadium, the Argos never showed another striking power as they recovered from a pushing around in the first quarter to hit for five touchdowns—four by forward passes and one other the off-shoot of a masterful outside kick.

Victory brought Argonauts their seventh Grey Cup as Canadian Rugby Union champions and marked the sixth time the famed double blues upheld the east without a setback in 20 years of east-west play for the trophy.

This was the same Winnipeg club the Argos blanked 35-9 in last year's final and although strengthened by four United States imports, they averted another shutout only on the third-half play of the game. Yet, by taking

## N. Y. Rangers Defeat Chicago Black Hawks 2-1

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—Ab Demarco rambled in an short shot in the last three minutes of play to give New York Rangers a 2-1 National Hockey League victory over the hapless Chicago Black Hawks before 16,776 fans. The defeat was the Blackhawk's ninth against five wins and one tie so far this season and kept them firmly entrenched in the league cellar, three points behind the fifth place Rangers.  
The game turned out to be a goalie's battle. New York's Chuck Rayner was ruffled by a late shot from the Blue Hawks' Doug Bentley, who was fouled by a Chicago player. Chicago's Paul Bibeault made 17 stops.  
Gaining their sixth triumph in 18 starts, the Rangers produced the first goal midway in the initial period on Tony Leswick's short shot unassisted. The Hawks tied

## Bruins Come From Behind To Tie Red Wings 3-3

BOSTON, Dec. 1.—(AP)—Boston Bruins protected their National Hockey League third rung by coming from behind for a 3-3 tie with Detroit Red Wings tonight before a capacity 18,000 crowd at the Boston Garden. Don Gallinger scored twice for the Bruins and Roy Conacher notched two for the Red Wings.  
The Red Wings, beaten in Montreal Saturday night, got away in slow fashion and were two goals down during the first 10 minutes. Milt Schmidt opened the scoring during the third minute and Gallinger got his first tally at 9:46. Both of those sharpshooters heat goalie Harry Lumley after taking potshots from behind his net.  
Red Doran sparked the travel-weary visitors late in the opening session by countering with an Eddie Bruneteau assist and Conacher, an old-time Bruin, scored first against his former teammates by backhanding in Billy Taylor's passout in the second period against the whistling in a past from rookie Tony Licari early in the finale.  
The Red Wings, however, were able to protect their 2-2 lead only about four minutes, until Gallinger finished off a determined five-man drive by beating Lumley from close range with the equalizer.  
It was the Bruins' sixth tie in their 18 starts to date and their second against Jack Adams' red-shirts, who were beaten on their previous visit here.

## Canadiens Punch Out 4-1 Win Over Detroit

### Toronto Leafs Shut Out Chicago 11-0

TORONTO, Dec. 1.—Place a body-battered sleeve before your camera and you'll have a picture of Chicago's defence and the reason the Black Hawks sank deeper into the National Hockey League cellar Saturday night while the leading Toronto Maple Leafs registered the season's most humiliating defeat, 11-0.  
There was nothing particularly wrong with goalie Paul Bibeault except that so much blue wool and black rubber flashed by him incessantly that in the third period he became puck punchy and retired to the Chicago bench for a rest on the official excuse of equipment trouble.  
Even a partisan crowd of 13,777 fans who enjoyed seeing the Leafs fatten their scoring averages by 7 points, felt genuinely sorry for the netminder. He received practically no support from his jelly-like defence.
