LONDON, July 10.—(CP)—Nurses who returned with the British Expeditionary Force from Flanders told of the dogged courage of wounded soldiers and of constant air attacks on hospital units by German airplanes. THREE DIMENSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHY CANADIAN ROCKIES SCENERY

JASPER, Alta., July 11.—Completing for the first time a series of colored photographs of Canadian Rockies scenery under the new process of "three dimension photography," Robert V. Brost, ace outdoor photographer of Chicago, has left Jasper Park Lodge for the coast after making photographs in Jasper National Park for three days. Explaining the new system, Mr. Brost stated that three dimension photographs were a portrayal of the subject as near as it is possible to get to it, the view of the human eye. "We look at an object with two eyes," he said, "the ordinary camera view it through one lens, thereby lacking depth, which is the third dimension, height and width being the other two. My special camera takes pictures through two lenses and when we project this on a screen and look at it through glasses, the effect is like that of sensation."

CANADIAN GOATS FOR CHILE. SOUTH AMERICA VANCOUVER, B. C., July 11.—A party of 12 British Columbians have left Vancouver bound for Valparaiso, Chile, South America.

TOURISTS. Four males and eight females, were speeded eastward via Canadian National Express to Toronto where they were to make connections for New York. There they will embark for the long ocean voyage to Valparaiso.

TOURISTS are twelve purchased by A. A. MacMillan, Dominion Livestock Branch, Ottawa, for the Department Technico Agricola de la Caja de la Pablation. Popular Valparaiso, from prominent breeders on Vancouver Island and the mainland. Eight animals collected in Eastern Canada were added to the shipment at Toronto.
