ALL NEWS OF LOCAL INTEREST

An evangelistic service will be held in the W. C. T. U. this afternoon, at the usual hour of meeting 3.30.

The three masted schooner Empress owned by George Wightman New York to Halifax is ashore on Blanche Island near Port la Tour and in a dangerous position.

Messrs Poole & Thompson, Montague, purchased of David Reid, Victoria Cross, a bronze turkey which tipped the scales at 30 lbs. The turkey was dressed and is a specimen of the good stock of poultry kept by Mr. Reid.

The Gazette learns that Messrs Peake Bros. & Co. have chartered the steamer "Anastasia" to sail from Liverpool G. E. on or about April 15th with a full cargo of salt, consisting of 20,000 bags, she will be due here about May 1st.

From a letter received by a friend in this city it is learned that Rev. Mr. Teasdale, a former pastor here, has recovered from an attack of pneumonia. It was not a recurrence of his former trouble, as had been feared. Many friends will be glad to learn of the Rev. gentleman's recovery.

Rev. William Tweedie, retired Methodist minister of Hampton, died Friday. He was 58 years old. He leaves a widow and family of three—Prof. W. M. Tweedie, Mt. Allison University, a former G. H. C. scholar; Mrs. W. Bear, formerly of P. E. Island, now of Nelson, B. C.; and Miss Tweedie, living at home.

IN MEMORIAM Captain James W. Irving, of Cherry Valley, P. E. Island, died in great peace on Monday, March 2nd, 1908, aged 62 years. The life of our departed brother was far more than an ordinary stirring and eventful one. In his early manhood he belonged to the company of those "who go down to the sea in ships, who see the works of the Lord and His wonders in the deep." During the awful conflict in the United States he served on board a Northern war vessel and took part in some desperate engagements, seeing death and destruction all around him. The hardship and exposure doubtless shattered his formerly vigorous constitution so that for the last few years he has lived in comparative retirement. Although unable to read anything that was said by those around him, he had a good acquaintance with the Scriptures, and derived great consolation from reading and meditating on the glorious truths taught therein. Our dear brother gradually and gently sank into the arms of death, to be forever with the Lord. His remains were followed to their resting place in the beautiful valley graveyard by the side of Cherry Valley church, by a large concourse of people, the wife and Rev. Mr. McNeil (Presbyterian) conducting the funeral service. —W. E. Layan.

CIGARETTES TO BE MADE ILLEGAL

Hon William Ross Wouldn't Allow Tobacco at all

The Prohibition Resolution Was Carried in House of Commons by a Vote of 103 to 48.

OTTAWA, April 1.—In the house of commons Mr Bickerdike moved a resolution calling for prohibition of the importation, manufacture and sale of cigarettes. He referred to certificates from leading Canadian physicians to show that many evil effects followed the use of cigarettes. Boys were cursed by the habit, and something should be done to put an end to the practice of cigarette smoking. In forty-two states of the American Union anti-cigarette laws were passed. In one year, 1898 to 1899, this had resulted in a reduction of the sale of cigarettes by one billion. No business man wanted a cigarette fiend in his employ and it was in the interest of boys that they should be protected.

Mr. Holm's strongly supported the motion. He considered the evil among boys was as serious a menace to public welfare as opium smoking. H. J. Logan opposed the motion in strong language. He objected to federal interference in the matter, on the ground that it was a question to be passed on by the local legislatures. Any prohibitory law would be a dead letter.

A large number of speakers on both sides supported the measure, including Ross, of Victoria, and Kaulbach. The former said that if he had his way, tobacco in any form would be strictly prohibited.

Mr. Tarts, while he wished the evils remedied, did not believe in coercion. He thought relief was to be found in educating the children to form good habits. He thought all smoking should be discouraged.

Mr. Brock suggested that parents should pay more attention to the instruction of children in the homes and thus provide a remedy.

Sir W. Laurier admitted the injurious effects which follow the use of cigarettes by children. He would not prohibit adults from indulging in innocent amusement. He agreed with Mr. Brock's suggestion of better home training. If provincial laws were ineffective he could not see that a Dominion statute would be more beneficial.

On division, the resolution was carried by a vote of 103 to 48.
