### Sunday School Lesson

LESSON IV.—JULY 27.

VICTORY OVER THE TEMPTER. Scripture Lesson.—Matt. 4: 1-11. Golden Text.—In that he himself had suffered being tempted, he is able to succor them that are tempted.—Heb. 2: 18.

Devotional Reading.—Heb. 4: 14-16; 1 Cor. 10: 12, 13.

Reference Material.—Mary 1: 12, 13; Luke 4: 1-13.

THE LESSON TEXT.—Matt. 4: 1-11.

THE TEXT EXPLAINED

1. Led up of the Spirit.—Mark used the will stronger expression: "the Spirit drove him forth." The wilderness. An uninvited and uninhabited region; not a desert in the sense of a barren and waste. To be tempted.—It is a word of the divine and the devil. The Saviour, newly equipped for his great life mission, should be thus tested. The devil—Literally, the false accuser, the slanderer. Here referring to Satan, the prince of demons, and the bitter enemy of God and of His Messiah.

2. Forty days.—Spent by Jesus in prayerful contemplation of and planning of the future of the Kingdom to begin. Fatigued and almost exhausted, but with the vision of that life-work clearly before him, Jesus was especially susceptible to the temptations which were now presented to him.

3. The tempter came.—Not necessarily in human form, since the strong appeals which come to man are not wholly within the mental and spiritual realm. Satan, the prince of evil, came in the form of a tempter, in view of the special equipment of power and authority which he actually tested. That these temptations came in the form of a tempter, physical need which formed the basis of this first temptation.

4. The holy city.—Jerusalem. Pinnacle—Or, wing.

5. Cast thyself down.—A temptation to make a spectacular display of the miraculous power and protection at his command, and by so doing conquer the Jewish people of his Messiahship. The Jewish—Psa. 91, 11, 12 Satan misquotes the passage given, omitting the very important clause "to keep thee in order by ways," thus distorting the meaning.

6. Showeth him all the kingdoms of the world.—An impossibility if interpreted literally, which fact lends cogency to the argument that the whole series of temptations here recorded transpired wholly within the mental or spiritual realm.

7. Fall down and worship me.—Satan's higher spiritual things for temporal advantage and glory; surrender the consciousness of fidelity to a high purpose and mission for worldly advantage.

8. Get thee hence, Satan.—The subtleness of the series of temptations requires determined action, an uncompromising decision. To harbor longer suggestions of Satan would be to surrender.

9. The devil leaveth him.—Luke adds "for a season," thus indicating that temptation was not banished at once and forever from the experience of Jesus, and implying that there were times at least during his life when temptation again assailed him.

LESSON THEMES.

Three Forms of Temptation. Three obvious tendencies in man's nature to which temptations often appeal are: (1) his carnal or physical desires—lust; (2) the desire for worldly possession—greed; and (3) the craving for power and authority—ambition. Fundamentally, these three tendencies are very closely related to each other. They all represent forms of selfishness, which at bottom is the cause of most of the misdeeds of the world. In the passage given, are included the Word of God for pointing out to us not only the danger of temptation, but also the way of escape. There is a climax in every temptation at which we must either part company with the tempter or surrender.

tion. Perhaps the most effective way of fortifying ourselves against temptation is to spread our daily program with profitable endeavor that there will be no time for those things which have no abiding worth. A mind filled with that which is noblest and best in literature and the high aspirations of men, a heart permeated with devotion to a lofty ideal of service, a life fully occupied with the affairs of the Kingdom and in harmony with the teachings of the Word of God, will be secure against the temptation to live for self. When temptation does come the promises of God will sustain us. It is the writer to the Hebrews who reminds us that the sympathy of Christ was not that which we are able; but will, with the temptation, marks also the way of escape, that ye may be able to endure it."

The Help of Divine Sympathy. The temptations of Jesus gives us the assurance of his sympathy and help. His sympathy is real because his temptation was real. For our sin Jesus does not have sympathy—he has forgiveness. He has sympathy for our infirmities (Heb. 4: 15, 16). We may therefore come "boldly" into the throne of grace. "This help and inspiration is personal. Frederick W. Robertson, the great Brighton preacher, declared that the sympathy of Christ was not merely love of men in masses; he loved the masses, but he loved them because made up of individuals. He had compassion on the multitude; but he distinguished special tender compassion for erring Peter and erring Thomas. He felt for the despised, lonely Zaccheus in his sycamore-tree. His compassion was for the individual. He mixed his tears with the stifled sobs by the grave of Lazarus. He called the abashed children to his side."

There was no divine help given Jesus which, through Jesus, may not also be given us. Thus, "we are more than conquerors through him that loved us."
