Mrs. James Holmes, Hampshire, has received the following letter from her son Ira who went overseas, over two years ago last April, with the Mounted Rifles:—He says

France
August 22 1918.

Dear Mother:—

It seems a long time since I have written to you but I hope you will forgive me for I have been very busy. I received the nice parcel you sent me and I thank you for it, it is certainly nice to get some treats from home. At the present time I am taking a ten days course in veterinary work and it is very interesting, I consider myself lucky for it is a good rest. This is the second rest I have had this summer.

I haven't had a letter from you for a considerable time and I have been wondering how Gordon came out on the Examinations.

Some people seem to think that the war will be over this year but I think it will go well into next summer. Judging by the victories that the Allies are having at the present time we should finish it quickly but we are up against a resourceful nation and it will have to be a fight till they are wiped out.

THE BRITISH DRIVE

The following letter from Mack MacLeod written to his father, D.B. MacLeod, of Ashby, tells of the British drive and its accomplishment: The writer spent his boyhood days in the vicinity of Bradalbane and has quite a number of friends here who will be glad to learn that he is not as badly wounded as the first report stated.

"Dear Dad: I must ask your pardon for not writing you sooner and letting you know where I am and how I am getting along, but my arm was so painful that I was unable to write until today. I am not very badly hurt. I have three superficial wounds in the right shoulder and one in the right hip, none are very serious, although my arm is a bit stiff.

We sure gave "Old Fritz" what for and that is the main thing. The attack was a complete surprise and no doubt that is why it was so successful. It was an ideal morning for an attack with a ground mist which made it impossible for him to see us and as zero had arrived in quietness we climbed out of our little trench and started after him.

The guns opened up on his lines and in less time than it takes to tell the silence was shattered and an inferno was let loose. Words fail to give any idea of what a modern attack is like the whistle and shriek of shell, the crash when they explode the rattle of the machine guns, the roar of the tanks and whippets—small tanks, capable of great speed), and once in a while a shout from the boys as we over. All this combined made a fearful din, once heard never to be forgotten. We went over to win and win we did.
