GOING ON VACATION.—Major George J. Crosby, American Consul, intends taking a two months leave of absence within the next few days. He will be relieved by Vice Consul de Carriere Arthur B. Giroux, who is now on duty in the Consulate General at Halifax. Mr. Giroux though born in Massachusetts was appointed to the American Consular Service from the State of New York, September 7, 1920. His first assignment was as Vice Consul in the City of Quebec. Mr. Giroux will probably arrive in Charlottetown on the evening train Friday, Nov. 3rd.

NARROW ESCAPE.—Two men belonging to Souris, Angus Bras d'Or, and A. M. McDonald, had a narrow escape from drowning in the rain storm last Tuesday. These men were coming from Inverness, C.B., bound for Souris. The engine gave out, and they set a sail which in the breeze soon was shattered to pieces. The boat was blown with wind and tide, eventually striking the shore at South Lake. There was a big surf on shore and the boat was capsized three times. The men bravely clung to her and both being good swimmers, succeeded in landing at South Lake almost exhausted.

SUCCESSFUL ISLANDER.—A Winnipeg paper of recent date contains an excellent photo of Mr. J. E. Keough, formerly of North Trigon, which it designates as "the winning butter." Mr. Keough took first prize at the Canadian National Exhibition at Toronto last month in a competition open to the world. This butter won first place among all Canadian exhibits at the National Dairy Show in Chicago in 1921. It did the same in 1920 and 1919. Crescent butter stood first in the Educational contest conducted by the Dominion Department of Agriculture in Aug. 1921 with a score of 96.7 points out of a possible 100. It has cleaned up big competitions at the Western fairs this year thereby duplicating its achievements of former seasons. Mr. Keough has been in the west for upwards of fifteen years, but he earned his trade in Trigon, which was famous for its good butter makers.

## Railway Problems

Mr. J.A. Messervy sent and received the following telegrams, which speak for themselves:—

Ch'town 30th. Oct. To S.J. Hungerford, Vice-President and General Manager Canadian National Railways Toronto, Ont.

Received message from Minister of Railways stating he was restoring discontinuance of late trip car ferry to you. For the benefit of our Province, kindly arrange to take mails and passengers arriving from United States and Montreal at Sackville at six o'clock each day on Ocean Limited. This will save twelve hours to every passenger and if they arrive at Sackville Saturday they cannot leave Sackville before Monday. For the benefit of our trade operate both trips and if freight moving in large quantities get steamer Scotia to assist, but remember if the late trip is taken off, it will take twenty-four hours after arrival of Ocean Limited at Sackville before passengers can reach Charlottetown a distance of eighty five miles and will take 48 hours to reach Souris, Georgetown, Montague and Murray Harbor, one hundred and fifty miles from Sackville and can travel from Montreal to Winnipeg, fourteen hundred miles in forty-six hours. You will see the disadvantage our Province is under. Please reply.

Your message of 30th. in regard to double daily ferry service between Tormentine and Borden, this question has been thoroughly considered and discussed with those officers having the most intimate knowledge of local situation on many occasions and their advice is that in the interest of safety, the ferry should not be operated after dark during late fall and winter months, particularly when carrying passengers. In nineteen nineteen, single service was inaugurated about first of October, in order to provide more time for ferries to handle freight, but on consideration from various persons, it was decided to continue double passenger service each year until first of November, and also to restore it as early as possible in the spring having regard to ice and weather conditions and this policy has been followed since. While the Scotia had one end fitted up to suit the slips at Tormentine and Borden, about two years ago we had been used for relief purposes in the winter months when the Prince Edward Island being overhauled, the former is not available for this run at this time of year. It is unfortunately true that passengers from west on Ocean Limited, are compelled to wait overnight, but the Maritime Express provides excellent service and has close connections at Montreal from all points beyond, even to Vancouver. Substitution of the single passenger service between approximately first of November and first of May each year is apparently a matter of physical necessity and not one of choice or policy and we certainly regret the resulting inconvenience to people of your province.

## ENTERTAINMENT ALLOWANCE FOR CANADIAN OFFICERS

OTTAWA, Nov. 2.—Provision for commanding officers in the Royal Canadian Navy who incur expenditures upon official entertainments, beyond the ordinary scale of hospitality is provided for by an order issued Friday, providing for payment of entertainment allowance of 60 cents per day to Lieut.-Commanders and Lieutenants of the R.C.N. when appointed senior naval officers at Esquimaut or Halifax or whilst senior officers sent for their thoughtfulness.
