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VICTIMS OF ROMA DISASTER BURIED

NEWPORT News, Va., Feb. 27.—All business here and at Norfolk and other surrounding communities was suspended today during the public funeral services held here for the thirty-four victims of the disaster which befell the army dirigible Roma.

During the brief services conducted by army chaplains and several of the local ministers, airplanes from Langley Field flew over the ground of Casino Park and dropped flowers on the row of flag draped caskets.

An unnamed soldier from among the dead in the disaster to the airship Roma was selected as representative of all those who lost their lives in the fatal flight. Resting in

a plain casket under the folds of the flag on a grassy prominence in the centre of a high hollow square he received for himself and the

thirty-five others who died in the disaster a last farewell from his comrades and from others among whom he had lived.

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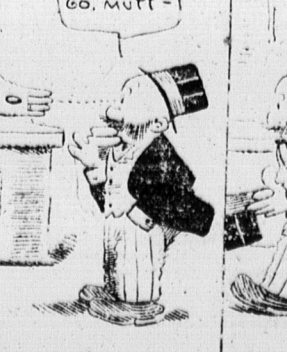
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
