served as a charm. The party was received at the large and regaled with choice pieces of freshly killed seals and stayed with horn flagons of blood soup.

Even the dogs received large portions of hoh boiled meat. The party remained for several days in the newly found village, which is in the middle of Dolphin and Union Strait and north of Cape Bexley.

Mr. Stefansson expatiates on the details which he sent to H. L. Bridgeman and which have been given in the Herald. He seems convinced that many of the strange race which he saw there, some with light beards and hair, were descendants of a Norwegian colony of 3,000 souls which disappeared in the fifteenth century from Greenland. He also has something to say about the possibility of their being descendants from forty Englishmen who were lost from one of the Sir John Franklin expeditions.

"The Victorian people," continues Mr. Stefansson, "differ strikingly from those of the mainland, except from the Akulikaitagmiut, who were much intermarried with the people north. They have a definitely European appearance, especially in the matter of beards, which are abundant and uniformly blond, some even red. I have seen none with blond hair, but Captain Mogg and others who he wintered north of Kanhabmuit report hair dark brown and blue eyes. I have seen perhaps forty Eskimos, half blood children and adults; and none of them had hair noticeably lighter than full bloods, and none had light colored eyes.

Numerous explorations have been made by the travelers on the sites of former villages in the Far North and many interesting specimens bearing on the civilization and progress in those remote lands have been gathered. The speech of the Eskimos gave possibly centuries ago there had been shipwrecked white men from whalers concerning whom there were dim traditions.

Messrs. Anderson and Stefansson, despite their many privations, were in good health, according to their last report.

The letters received yesterday were dated respectively from Langton Bay, on December 4, 1910, and from Dense River, Great Bar Lake, on January 21, 1911.
