POSSIBILITIES OF THE TROTTER.

S. W. Balch in the Scientific American eleven years ago propounded the theory that the speed of trotting horses would steadily increase, and that by the beginning of the present century the trotting record would be between 2.03 and 2.04. This proved to be the case, the Abbot in 1900 making the best record in 2.03. Thus in a hundred years the record had been lowered 58 2/3 seconds from the three minute record of the year 1800. It has since been lowered, as every one knows to two minutes flat by the remarkable performance of Lou Dillon. Mr. Balch has now written a second letter to the Scientific American in which he propounds the theory that the ultimate speed of the trotter will be a mile in 63 1/2 seconds, which will be constantly approached but never reached. In fact he proceeds by an elaborate calculation to show that it will take till the year 2,100 to reach the minute and a half mark.

MARINE FREE DELIVERY.

The great lakes which divide Canada from the United States, containing as they do half the fresh water in the world, are now the home of a vast commerce. As has been before told in these columns, the tonnage which passes the American and Canadian canals at the Soo during the seven months of open navigation is nearly three times as great as the tonnage which passes through the Suez canal during the year. An army of men estimated at 53,000 man these lake craft. They have fathers, mothers, wives, sisters brothers and friends with whom from time to time they may wish to communicate or who may wish to communicate with them. It was found that the majority of the letters addressed to these sailors reached the dead letter office and failed to find the persons addressed.

To supply these people with their mails and take off letters from the hundreds of vessels without interfering with the rushing traffic, a scheme of marine free delivery was organized which has proved a great success. Detroit was selected as the place for its operation, and a little white steamer engaged with an attendant boat, and men accustomed to boats and taught the duties of postmen put on board. There is a day and night crew on board and the little steamer visits every craft that passes Detroit by day or night and delivers such mail on board as may be addressed to each vessel, taking off whatever mail is required to be sent ashore. This is effected by means of a bucket let down over the side of the passing ship without stopping or checking her speed.

The little mail steamer during the season of 1902 made 22,924 trips to passing vessels and received and delivered 478,023 letters, telegrams, special delivery letters and other pieces of postal matter. The experiment was cautiously tried and in the first month only 90 letters were delivered, but the business grew so rapidly that before the first season closed 500 papers and letters were being delivered daily. Last year the money order system was extended to this service, affording every possible facility for the sailors to remit money to relatives or to savings banks. Better than all, the experiment, which at first was laughed as visionary, has proved not only a great convenience to tens of thousands but has turned out to be a paying one as well, the revenue exceeding the cost.
