### PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN PARIS

How Children Are Educated In the French Capital.  
Public schools differ in many respects in Paris from those of this country. Children in the French capital enter the primary department when as young as six years and remain until 12. If they are to continue their education the highest primary schools receive them for a few years longer until they are ready for the secondary schooling, which is given in colleges, or in the professional and trade schools.

Not only is the instruction free, but the city helps the boys and girls to live in the meantime. They do not learn alone from books, but even in the primary schools the girls are taught the arts of cooking and house-keeping, how to go to market and how to make and mend their dresses. The boys are taught, if they wish, the trades of joinery and blacksmithing.

From the very beginning boys and girls are put in separate schools, although the course of instruction and the discipline is practically the same for each sex. The French public school buildings remind one of an orphan's home. They contain a kitchen, dining-room, a place of steaming hot water for the pupils are the children of the nation and treat them as such. Only those who can well afford it are supposed to contribute toward the maintenance of the schools. The children receive all books, paper and stationery from the state. Whether they are rich or poor. Besides this, the city furnishes them with a meal at the noon hour. The Paris children do not bring their lunch with them, but are provided with a hot meal at the public expense. Lunch consists of a bowl of soup and a plate of steaming hot vegetables. They are expected to bring their own bread and if they wish to drink milk instead of water must bring that themselves. Sometimes mothers furnish them with a bit of fruit or pastry, by way of dessert, which they are allowed to eat with their lunch.

If the parents are poor their children are given the lunch free and are also furnished with a sufficient quantity of bread and milk. If the children who come to school are not, in the opinion of the teachers, sufficiently well and comfortably dressed, inquiry is at once made to ascertain the cause. Should it be found that poverty is responsible for their poor appearance, the school authorities supply them with suitable clothing. For this purpose an appropriation is made by the city, and contributions are solicited from the rich.

The children in the public schools have 178 holidays in the year and the Paris school authorities assist the pupils in spending their vacations wisely and well. Vacation journeys paid by the city are frequent. The children who enjoy these free trips to the country are chosen from all who have behaved themselves. The wealthy children, of course, are expected to pay for their trips when they go along with the others.

Besides manual training features, which are much the same as those introduced in the public schools of this country, every pupil in the primary department is required to learn some drawing and the elements of singing. Higher education is also provided and bright boys are given free college instruction.
