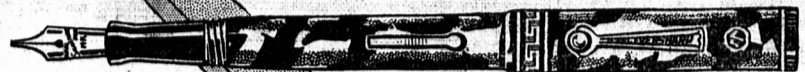

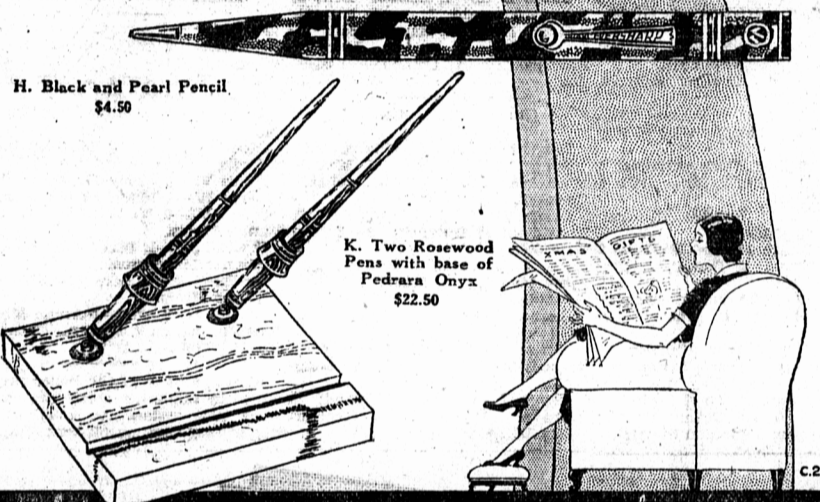

## Livestock Market

(Canadian Press)  
MONTREAL, Dec. 12—Livestock. There were 67 cattle, 50 calves, 347 hogs and 171 sheep and lambs for sale on the two markets. There was not enough stock offered to make any change. Quotations on good steers were firm, good cows about steady and common to medium cows weak, canners and cutters and common bulls were unchanged. Good steers sold up to \$10.50 and top heifers up to \$10.00. Common light steers sold around \$7.50. Good cows were quoted up to \$8.00 and the bulk of common

to medium cows between \$5.00 and \$6.50. Canners and cutters \$3.75 to \$4.75 and bulls \$5.50 to \$6.50. Grass calves were around \$4.50 and veals were from \$11.00 to \$14.00. Common lambs not graded sold for \$10.00 to \$11.00, good lambs sold for \$11.50 and sheep for \$3.50 to \$6.00.

The bulk of the hogs were delivered under contract at prices ranging from \$10.00 to \$10.25 fed and watered flat, sows were from \$3.00 to \$8.25.

### WOMEN TO HUNT TREASURE

Two adventure-loving women and a man of 70 recently left Belfast, Ireland, on an expedition to

salve the Armada treasures from the Spanish galleon Almirante de Florencia, which sank in Tobermory Bay in 1558. They are Lady E. Fox-Pitt, daughter of the Marchioness of Queensberry, Mrs. Margaret Leask, wife of a retired naval officer and member of a small clan, and Colonel K. N. Foss, retired army officer. Foss says that despite his years he does not object to diving for treasure. The party will spend at least a month and nearly \$15,000 working on the galleon. "I don't think anybody has actually seen the vessel since it sank in Tobermory Bay three centuries ago," said Mrs. Leask, "but treasures have been recovered from it—coins, silver plate, and so

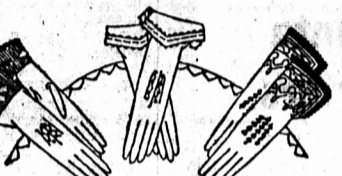

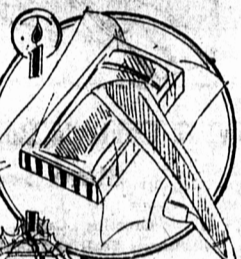

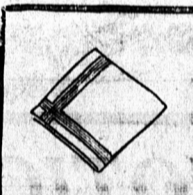
