GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Jan. 24 (CP) - Rye showed independent strength today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange as coarse grain prices moved narrowly in a dull session.

Under light commission house offerings and American demand, rye prices closed 1 1/2 to 1 1/8 cents higher.

An easier tone on the Chicago market contributed to hesitation in oats and barley dealings. Oats came in for some light shipper buying, while barley attracted demand from shippers, processors and exporters. Offerings, mostly commission house selling and hedging sales, were light.

In the only export business, 450,000 bushels of wheat were allocated to the United Kingdom under the Canadian wheat agreement. Class two wheat prices remained unchanged from Saturday.

Stock Market Prices Irregular To Lower

NEW YORK, Jan. 24 (AP) - After wavering back and forth most of the day, the stock market tipped downward for moderate losses.

Buying strength in the steel group, particularly U. S. Steel, kept the list on the top side for considerable periods, but at the end prices were spread a point in either direction.

Rails, motors, oils, chemicals and airlines were lower, while metals, aircraft, utilities and merchandising shares were mixed.

The three most active stocks were U. S. Steel, Bethlehem and Armco, in that order.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 3/8 of a point to 65.9. The industrial component of the average was off 3/8, rails off 4/8 and utilities were unchanged on average.

At Toronto

TORONTO, Jan. 24 (CP) - Base metal stocks featured the slowest fall session on the Toronto Stock Exchange today since Jan. 3. Several low price metals advanced strongly in moderate trading with five issues touching new tops.

Gold's dipped in late trading, Western oil held firm as a few stocks showed moderate advances. Waite Amulet held the limelight in base metals, advancing to a new high at 14 1/4 in strong dealings and then easing to 13 3/4. A gain of 1/2 from the previous close. Drill results from the property in the Rouyn district of Northern Quebec were announced late today.

Fund Oreille and its subsidiary, Reeves MacDonald, low-priced west-coast base metals, were at new highs and Quemont touched a new top at \$17, Sherritt, Noranda, Normetal and Golden Manitou were also firmer while Consolidated Smelters sagged \$1 at \$117.

Gold's held steady for most of the session but weakened towards the close. Senior issues showed fractional losses and juniors were mixed about equally.

Foothills added 15 cents at \$3.30 in a steady western oil list. Pacific Petroleum was strong in early dealings but sagged in the last hour to \$2.80, a decline of five cents.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, Jan. 24 (CP) - Narrow irregularity was featured by most issues traded on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market today.

Trading was light in both industrials and mines.

Papers, oils and beverages moved into lower ground. The little activity on the two markets mainly was concentrated on oil issues.

B. O. Oil Pfd rose a fraction to 25 1/2 in a soft group. Losers included South Brazeau, McColl, Anglo-Canadian and Gaspé. International Petroleum was unchanged.

International Nickel, Aluminum and Noranda were on the upswing in metals, but Hudson Bay Mining slipped 3/4 at 53, Segrams and Canadian Breweries lost 1-8 and 1-4, respectively in beverages.

Improved in the balance of the list were Bathurst, at a new high of 22 3/4, Asbestos, Dominion Bridge, Massey-Harris, Standard Chemical and Royal Bank. Bank of Commerce dipped 1/8.

Normetal added 10 cents to a new high of \$3.70 in mines. Waite Amulet reached a new high of \$14 1/4, then eased slightly and closed at \$14 for a net gain of 3-8. Quemont was at a new high of \$16 3/4.

Trebort dropped five cents to 57 and Candego, most active issue in group, was off three cents at 21.

Of 195 issues traded, 82 were higher, 58 lower and 85 unchanged. Five new highs and one new low were established.
