FAIL DON'T AGREE WITH MR. PHILLIPS

The Prison Life and the Investigation Begins to Tell on the Notorious York Loan Man . . . There Will Never Be Such a Company Again.

TORONTO, April 9.—Joseph Phillips, president of the York County Loan and Savings Company, accused of conspiracy, is beginning to show the strain of the investigation, and it is evident the detention is telling on him. His hair, a jet black when the investigation began, has now some streaks of gray, and he is pale, although his demeanor is unchanged. Although allowed to obtain his meals from outside, he has to experience many of the hardships of the ordinary remand prisoner, and he is not allowed to be driven to and from the jail in a hack, but has to go in the patrol wagon with the ordinary herd of prisoners. Public interest in the proceedings is growing rapidly, and the court room cannot accommodate those who wish to get a view of the prisoner. This afternoon Mr. Curry again took E. J. Burt in hand, questioning him as to what he had done with the cheques he had received, but he elicited very little information. He did not know

where the money he loaned to Phillips came from, but, in admitting he had netted \$17,000 from the Toronto Life, he said the money was his own and he intended to keep it.

"I think you ought to hand it over to the York County Loan," said Mr. Curry. "You will never have an opportunity of earning the same during the rest of your natural life."

"The Toronto Life built up a nice little business," was the witness reply.

"You never before heard of a company that had a York County Loan to fall back upon," retorted Mr. Curry.

"No," the witness admitted; "you will never have a York County Loan again."

"That's right," Mr. Curry proceeded, "I think the people of this country have had a sufficient lesson until a new generation has grown up that knew not Joseph." The crowd in the court laughed, but were called to order by the police. The case goes on tomorrow.

RESOLUTIONS RE THE SUNDAY BILL.

At a regular diet of worship held in the Presbyterian Church, Bonshaw, on Sunday, 8th inst. the following resolution, moved by the pastor, Rev. A. D. McDonald, and supported by Rev. J. Tiner, and J. J. McLeod, elder, was unanimously adopted by a standing vote of the congregation:—

Whereas the preservation of the Lord's Day as a National day of rest is a matter of vital importance to us as a Christian people and,

Therefore resolved that our representatives in Parliament assembled be strongly urged to defend and support the Sunday Bill now before the House, and to use every proper means possible to prevent its defeat, or the passing of emasculating amendments to any of its wise and necessary provisions.

A similar resolution was also presented at the close of a largely attended service held in the Presbyterian Church, Tryon, on Sunday afternoon. It was supported by Alex. Morrison, elder, Wm. Morrison and D. J. Thompson and adopted by a unanimous standing vote.

Our people here are recently alive to the situation and are in fullest sympathy with the L. D. A. in the efforts being put forth to obtain for Canada needful and adequate Sunday legislation. It should be generally realized that the present situation is not only one of great opportunity, but also of grave danger. The enemies of the Lord's Day are working hard to defeat the Bill. Let all who love and respect the Day now put forth every effort for its preservation.
