### Robinson's Bakery Install New Oven

The old-established Summerside industry, Robinson's Bakery, now owned and managed by Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Kelly, well-known as the proprietor for years of that other old establishment, the Toronto Bakery, has recently had installed a Master Baker, Revolving Tray type oven, the first to be installed in this province.  
This mammoth oven has a capacity of 360 loaves of bread at a baking and at every forty minutes can be reloaded with another 360. The oven, which has a weight of 15,000 pounds, is impressive in appearance, with its four-panel enamelled front over twelve feet in length and extending back a similar distance. A full view of its operations is afforded from the front of the oven. Upon the pressing of a switch the eight large revolving trays which hold the loaves swing instantly, smoothly and silently into motion. The oven is heated by oil and the motive power is furnished by an electric motor. The heat is thermostatically controlled and the trays revolving, take 2-2 1/2 minutes for each revolution, the whole large batch of loaves being subjected to a heat of uniform degree at whatever temperature may be desired.  
This fine and thoroughly modern oven was built by the Bradford Oven and Rack Co. Ltd. of Bradford, Ont. to the order of
