Trophies Are Presented To Wanderers

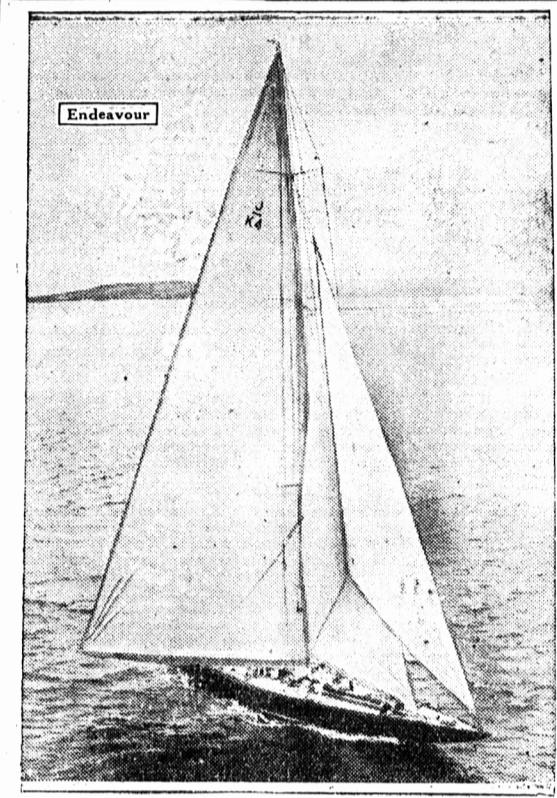

Will Stage Sport Meet

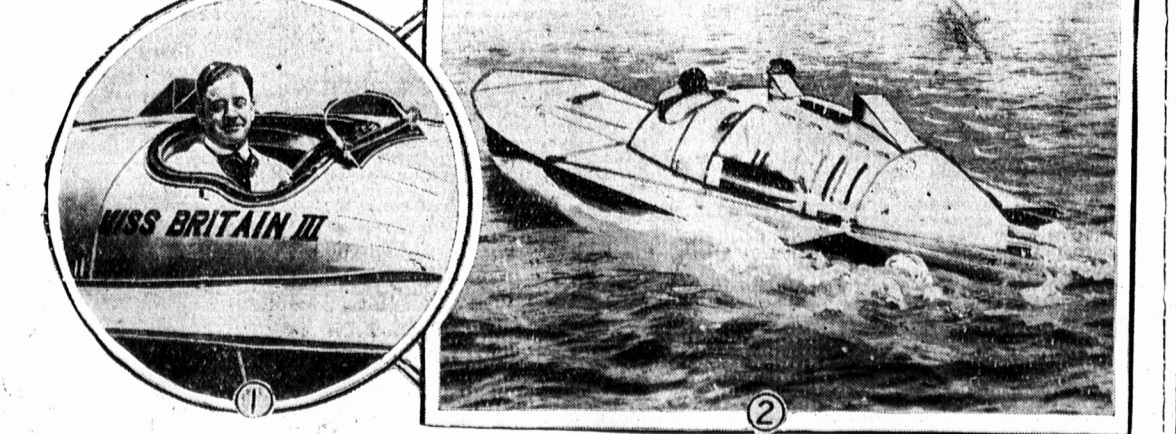
