U. S. GOVERNMENT MAY OPERATE COAL MINES

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22.—Federal Fuel Administration Garfield today warned coal operators and miners where strikes have occurred or are impending that the government would take charge of coal production if it continued to be threatened by strikes.

After the conference Mr. Garfield sent an appeal by telegraph to miners and operators to consider the national emergency and resume production.

After a conference with John P. White, president of the United Workers, over strikes called or impending, in Illinois, Ohio, and Indiana, Mr. Garfield sent a telegram to operators and miners alike giving notice that the government would deal most drastically with strikes intended to force a decision on a revision of government prices to meet wage increases.

COUNTING ON FIRST CLASS

Early Reports Indicate Large Number of Men will be Available as was Expected.

OTTAWA, Oct. 23.—Whether or not the first class to be called under the Military Service Act will supply the whole 100,000 men required is now a question of no little interest. Estimate having been made that there are 400,000 men fit for service in the first class. This includes men between the ages of 20 and 34 inclusive who are unmarried or widowers without children on July 6, 1917.

As many men as possible are wanted from the first class, for several reasons. Young men without responsibilities like these are most easily transplanted from civilian to military life; also, these are the ages at which the average man is best-fitted physically. Again, the selection for the army of men with the fewest dependents means a minimum drain upon the country's financial strength.

Reports from all points indicate that the early coming forward of members of the first class is such as to justify confident predictions as to the increase in reinforcements to be expected from this one class. 769-10-23ME11.
