Terrific Storm In U. S. and Ontario

PROVIDENCE, R. I., Sept. 14.—Damage estimated at hundreds of thousands of dollars was done by a brief hail and thunder storm accompanied by a 45 mile gale in a narrow area extending through Cranston, Warwick, and East Providence today.

Street car, telephone and electric lights and power service was interrupted. The hail stones in some cases measured one and a half inches in diameter.
