JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, Sept. 15-(C. P. Cable via Reuters) -A pageant of South Africa's history, and in particular the history of Johannesburg, was inaugurated here today with the opening of the Empire Exhibition.

The Exhibition, which will continue for four months, marks Johannesburg's 50th birthday. A message from the King said: "I wish to express my best wishes for the success of this great undertaking. I feel sure it will help to promote the trade and commerce of the Empire on which the well-being of its people largely depends."

A message of greeting from Prime Minister MacKenzie King of Canada which had been specially recorded, was broadcast from London.
