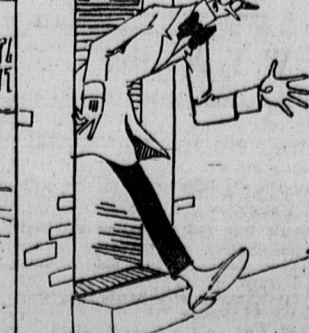
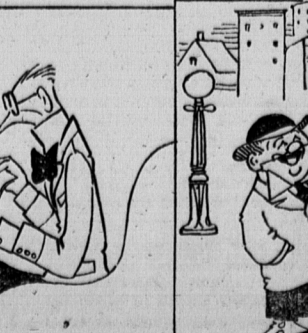
DICKY DIPPY'S DIARY.
