

Canadian Legion's Report On Canadian Aid To Russia Fund

The magnificent response by the people of Prince Edward Island to the appeal sponsored by the Canadian Legion for cash contributions to send help to the millions of homeless Russian civilians in the way of clothing, stoves, blankets, seeds, medicines, and other supplies has grown to \$15,614.70 when the official audit of the books was made. It was announced by Mr. N. W. Lowther, the general chairman of the Provincial Appeal. The Treasurer's report is as follows:— I have pleasure in advising you that total donations to the Canadian Aid to Russia Fund received by me amount to \$14,914.70 which has been remitted to the fund's headquarters, Toronto. These donations were received from the following districts: Charlottetown \$5,777.82. Mount Stewart, \$405.25. Eldon, \$11.55. Hunter River, \$120.27. Victoria, \$57. Balance Queen's County, \$1,679.65. Total Queen's County \$8,181.50. Through Summerside Legion \$4,266.56 acknowledged through Summerside Press Central Bedoune and District \$2,437.50. Balance Prince County \$147.60. Total Prince County \$4,658.21. Souris \$335.50. Montague \$589.75. Central Kings Carry-On-Canada Corps \$100. Bridgetown, Dundas and surrounding districts \$141.70. Annandale and Little Pond \$38. Murray River, Murray Harbor District \$182. Morell \$141.70. Balance King's County, \$336.15. Total King's County \$2,071.24. Cape Breton, Nova Scotia \$37.75. Grand Total \$14,914.70. As you are already aware the Provincial Government, in lieu of a cash donation, has shipped seeds valued at approximately \$700 to the Canadian Aid to Russia Fund Headquarters at Toronto. This brings the total donation from the Province up to \$15,614.70 which you must agree is a marvellous voluntary contribution. I feel that special mention should be made of the splendid response made by the Women's Institutes throughout the Province who were responsible for donations totalling approximately \$1,500. I wish to express my appreciation of the co-operation received from yourself and the Fund's efficient Secretary, Miss Dorothy Lowther, as well as the co-operation received from the collectors and committees throughout the Province in making prompt returns.
