WESTERN PRODUCERS GREATLY BENEFITED REGINA, Jan 9.—Hon. J. A. Merkle, Minister of Railways, Labor and Industries, today stated that, while Saskatchewan grain producers will receive substantial financial benefits from the application of Crosswest rates to Churchill, Saskatchewan live stock producers will also share in similar prosperity, because special commodity rates have been secured from all Saskatchewan points to Churchill on shipments of cattle and cured meats.

The provincial freight rates expert also drew attention to the fact that cattle and hogs processed in Saskatchewan packing-houses and exported as cured meats would also receive the benefit of very substantial freight reductions via the Hudson Bay route.
