TRIBUTES TO REV. DR. DOBSON.

The Patriot and Examiner of last evening paid heartfelt tributes to the worth and memory of Rev. Dr. Dobson. The Patriot remarks upon the fact that "his preaching was of that rare order that drew many—particularly the men—to church, who as a rule are irregular in their attendance at the House of God." It adds: "The flashing eye is dimmed, the eloquent voice is silent, and sorrowing thousands pay tribute to him who is gone. They will cherish his memory and the fragrance of his life; his work and worth will remain with those among whom he labored, inspiring them to the better life and winning souls for the King of Kings, whose representative he so truly was."

The Examiner in the course of an appreciative article remark upon what was a notable feature of Dr. Dobson's method in keeping in touch with the people and the occurrences of the time: "We have seen him in the Courts of Justice in the Legislature and at our public gatherings of all kinds. Always and every where he was seeking information, impression and ideas with which to carry on the work of his Master and the congregation committed to his care. It is hard to realize that he is gone so soon—and gone forever."

MAKING THEM WORK.

In several of the Provinces and neighboring States laws have been enacted and put in force to compel those committed to jail to work for their maintenance. These laws have proved beneficial in their working and it seems desirable that some similar enactment should be made in our own Province. It might be made discretionary with the convicting Magistrate when to impose the hard labor condition. There is a class in all the cities of Canada to whom the jail has no terrors, some of whom even welcome the comfort of the jail in the winter season.

In Detroit, Michigan, a law has recently gone into operation under which recreant husbands and fathers who fail to support their families are committed to jail and are there made to work. A portion of their earnings to the amount of a dollar and a half per week will go to the support of the wife and children. This will change the order of things set forth in the song entitled "Everybody Works but Father." The lazy fathers and husbands will have to work; either at liberty and voluntarily, or in jail under compulsion. The law is well adapted to other cities than Detroit.

A TEN MILLION CROP.

A published letter from Theodore Ross Secretary for Agriculture, contains the statement that the oat crop of this year on the Island must be well on to 9,000,000 bushels and at present prices is worth considerably more than \$4,000,000. Mr. Ross adds that it is quite possible that the total value of the farm crops this year reaches ten million of dollars.

These are handsome figures and should go far to cure any remaining traces of the "western fever" that may exist in the minds of our farmers. As Mr. Ross points out, the good crops and good prices of this year should give our people faith in the capabilities of our own Province. Such faith is always a most important asset and we believe it is really growing in our midst.

In New Brunswick the office of Attorney General has been vacant since the resignation of Hon. Dr. Pugsley some five months ago, and the Opposition journals are making sport of the hunt for a man to fill the place. One of their number intimates that if the Province can get along so well without an Attorney General for five months, the vacancy might be continued indefinitely without serious injury.

But Premier Robinson will not allow himself to be hurried in filling the place even though the Government papers feel assured there is abundance of good material to choose from. Sometimes there exists an embarrassment of riches in the way of aspirants for a good vacant position. The fact that a general election is near at hand may add to the difficulty of making a choice quickly.
