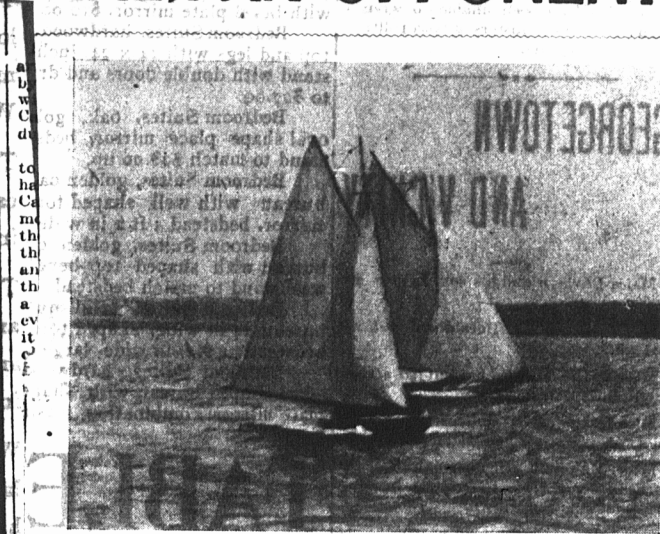

### THE CABOT AGAIN BEATEN BY THE CIBOU

A despatch received in the city Saturday evening stated that in the third race in Sydney for the Coronation Club between the Cibou of Sydney and the Cabot of Charlottetown, the Cibou won by twenty minutes. The Charlottetown gentlemen who own the Cabot need not be ashamed of their venture, however. They have shown commendable enterprise in thus fitting out a craft in the endeavor to wrest the sailing championship of the Maritime Provinces from the Royal Cape Breton Yacht Club. They had to content with almost unsurmountable obstacles. The Cibou was built by one of the most noted yachtsmen in Canada and was fitted with all the appurtenances that go to make a swift sailing boat. She possessed three spars, three sets of sails and the ones used for racing are devoted exclusively to this purpose. The Cabot on the other hand while designed and constructed by talented boatmen was handicapped in not having the equipment possessed by her opponent. Her crew too were amateurs while those of the Sydney boat have had a number of years experience.

BICKERDIKE EXPECTS ELECTION.

MONTREAL, Sept. 10.—Robert Bickerdike, member for St. Lawrence Division, Montreal, who is generally supposed to be in close touch with the Premier, confirms the report this morning that the dissolution of the Federal Parliament will be announced by Thursday.

MANITOBA'S VALUABLE CROP.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 10.—(Special)—Thodore Knipen, Secretary of the Western Canadian Immigration Association, estimates the wheat crop at 50,430,000 bushels, worth \$42,500,000, or ten millions better than last year's crop.

TREATY SIGNED WITH THIBET.

LHASA, Sept. 10.—Colonel Younghusband, the head of the British Mission and the Tibetan Council, signed a formal treaty yesterday in the apartments of the Dalai Lama at Potala.

TERMS NOT YET PUBLIC.

The terms of the treaty were read out only in the Tibetan language and the details will be published later by the Foreign Office at Simla.

The simple ceremony closed with short speech by Col. Younghusband.

## JAPS REPORTED NORTH OF MUKDEN

### THE JAP LOSSES.

It is reported the Japanese losses at Liao Yang were about twenty thousand and fully fifteen thousand at Port Arthur.

### NEW RUSSIAN MINISTER.

ST. PETERSBURG, Sept. 10th.—(Special.)—all the newspapers comment favorably on the appointment of Prince Peter Svisstopol Mirsky as Minister of the Interior, succeeding Von Plehve, who was assassinated.
