BE CONSULTED. THE PEOPLE WILL

Mr. Borden, finding the people of the Northwest in favor of reciprocity, and quite as much in favor of a general lowering of the customs tariff, to both of which he is opposed, raises the point that the people of Canada at large should be consulted in a general election before the trade agreement shall be ratified by Parliament. We are inclined to doubt whether he would be equally desirous to take a plebiscite on the broad question of general tariff reduction. What he seems to leave too much out of sight is the obvious fact that the people will very shortly—next year if not within the present year—be given an opportunity to pronounce upon the reciprocity issue. And their voice will be decisive. The Government of Sir Wilfrid Laurier stakes its existence on securing popular approval of the reciprocity agreement. If Mr. Borden can secure a majority in opposition to reciprocity at the polls the Laurier Government must go down and out and the reciprocity agreement can and will be abrogated at the first session of the new Parliament. This ought to satisfy even Mr. Borden.

REV. H. E. THOMAS' FAREWELL

Rev. Herbert E. Thomas, the esteemed and gifted Pastor of the First Methodist Church in this city, preached his farewell sermon to a large congregation last evening. This is preparatory to his removal with his family to St. John where he will continue his pastoral work. Many warm friends in this city will sincerely regret his removal. His acquaintance in this City and Province is the greater owing to the fact that the congregation is one of the largest in the Maritime Provinces and has always sustained a leading position among the Methodist churches in Prince Edward Island.

When he came to this pastorate Mr. Thomas succeeded to a pulpit which for years had been occupied by the late Rev. William Dobson, one of the foremost preachers of the Methodist Church in Canada. It is due to Mr. Thomas to say that with less prestige than his eminent predecessor at the beginning of his pastorate here, he succeeded in maintaining the large and regular attendance of the congregation during his term as pastor, with good fruits for the spiritual labors, alike in the spiritual and temporal progress of the church.

During Mr. Thomas' pastorate the First Methodist Church has been furnished with a splendid new organ, one of the largest and finest in the Maritime Provinces; a new and handsome parsonage was erected, while on the site of the former parsonage the Heartz Memorial Hall was built, supplying an excellent school-room and audience room for other purposes. No recent pastorate of the church had been marked by such valuable and important additions to the church property.

In his preaching Rev. Mr. Thomas has been characterized by clear, forceful and earnest presentation of Gospel truth, and plain and searching exposition of the evils of the time. He spared the vices and follies of no one because of the offender's wealth or social station. Apart from the cares of a very large and important pastorate, his activity along other lines has been great. In connection with temperance and prohibition, the Temperance Alliance, the Lord's Day Alliance, the Ministerial Association, and other agencies for the betterment of the community his energy was untiring throughout it all he maintained cordial relations with other Christian workers in the City and Province. Never outspoken and fearless in the cause of truth as he understood it, Mr. Thomas had filled an important and useful place in Christian work here during his stay in our midst.

Mrs. Thomas has during her residence in Charlottetown also proved cheerful and untiring worker in many lines of religious activity and promoting every agency for good. She had endeared herself greatly to those with whom she became thus associated alike within and without the congregation over which her husband was pastor. They leave Charlottetown, we believe with mutual regret on their part and on that of the congregation, and Mr. Thomas will enter upon his new pastorate in another and larger city well-acquainted.

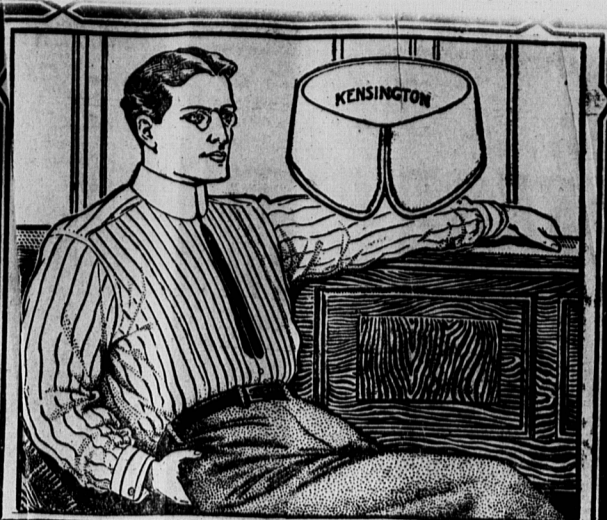

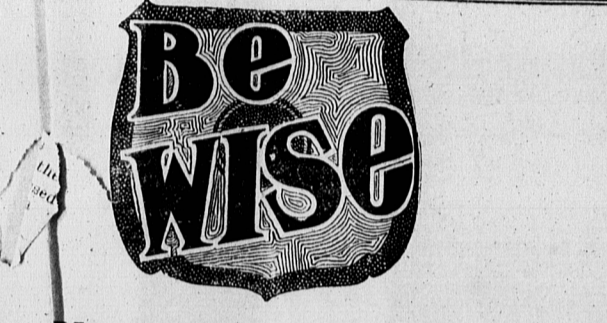
