CAIRO PRODUCES THE MOST BABES.

BEHLIN, July 2.—The highest birth rate in the world of all the great cities is Cairo; 45 on every ten thousand inhabitants, the lowest, 158 on ten thousand inhabitants, in Calcutta, per year.

The general figures below as prepared by the Imperial Board of Health, per ten thousand inhabitants and per year: Alexandria, 43; Cologne, 35; Buenos Ayres, 34; Madrid, 34; Rotterdam, 34; Liverpool, 32; Belfast, 31; Breslau, 30; Moscow, 30; Madrid and Sheffield, 30; Birmingham and Dublin, 29; Glasgow and Manchester, 29; Leipzig, 29; Copenhagen, 28; Dresden, 27; Budapest, 27; New York, 36; London, 26; Bristol, 23; Hamburg and Amsterdam, 25; St. Petersburg, 27; Milan, 25; Berlin, 25; Stockholm, 24; Prague, 23; Rome, 23; Odessa, 23; Edinburgh, 23; Paris, 18; Paris, 18; Brussels, 18; Lyons, 18.

The healthiest city, according to the small number of deaths occurring there per ten thousand inhabitants and per year is Sydney, namely, 107. In the other big towns of the world the mortality is as follows, per ten thousand inhabitants, and per year: Stockholm, 13; Amsterdam, 13; Chicago, 12; Rotterdam, 14; Bristol, 14; Brussels, 14; Frankfurt, 14; London, 15; Rio de Janeiro, 15; Hamburg, 15; Dresden, 15; Copenhagen, 15; Berlin, and Leipzig, 15; Edinburgh, 15; Sheffield, 16.

THE GRAND TRUNK'S MAY STATEMENT.

LONDON, July 2.—The Grand Trunk Railway statement for May shows gross receipts of Grand Trunk proper increased £77,000 sterling; working expenses increased £56,100. Canada Atlantic net profit was the same as the previous month. Grand Trunk western net profit decreased £8,700. Grand Haven net profit decreased £2,800. Total net profit, whole system, increased £9,400.
