A GREAT TEACHER.

The resignation of President Eliot of Harvard University has removed from that high position one of the greatest teachers of the higher learning that the present age has evolved.

Dr. Eliot has been connected with Harvard for over forty years. He was appointed to the presidency at early age of 35 years, and under his administration that already great national institution has prospered abundantly and widely extended its usefulness, its influence and its reputation.

These figures, striking as they are, tell but part of the story. In the great growth of the nation and the advancement of education, culture and wealth, scores of colleges have been called into being, some of them magnificently endowed, the new institutions being competitors with the old.

It is in the face of such competition that Harvard has made its way, largely because of the learning, the high character, the progressive spirit and the many fascinating qualities of the man at its head.

He stood for rectitude and sincerity and for reverence of all truth, with an almost superb indifference to popular favor or disfavour. And he helped greatly by his teaching and example to mould the lives of the young men to something of the calm dignity, the self-reverence and self-control and the noble serenity of his own life.

press of his mind and character upon great movements as well as upon rising great men, an influence wide, elevating and beneficent, and which will long survive his retirement from the president's chair.

NELSON'S FLAGSHIP.

There is not a more illustrious ship afloat, perhaps may never be, than the famous Victory which bore the flag of Admiral Nelson at the battle of Trafalgar, and over which on 21st October, 1805 he hoisted that eloquent signal, "England expects every man to do his duty."

After careful consideration the Admiralty have decided that the noble old ship is to be re-rigged, re-painted and as nearly as possible restored to the condition in which she gloriously led the port column of the British fleet into the battle at Trafalgar.

On Trafalgar Day a few weeks ago there was an interesting incident aboard the old flagship. For the first time in recent years Nelson's deathless signal was hoisted in the Victory in the exact flags with which he made it. All of which may have a local interest, as well as a patriotic interest for Charlottetown readers when the following particulars are added:

Our esteemed townsman Fred W. Hyndman served nine months in 1867-8 on board the old Victory at Portsmouth. His cabin was close alongside the cabin in which Nelson breathed his last after the battle of Trafalgar.

The late Captain R. W. Davies, R. N. (brother of Sir Louis Davies) was at the same time Lieutenant on board H.M.S. Excellent at Portsmouth, and the present Admiral Sir John Fisher, First Lord of the Admiralty, was Gunnery Lieutenant of the Excellent.

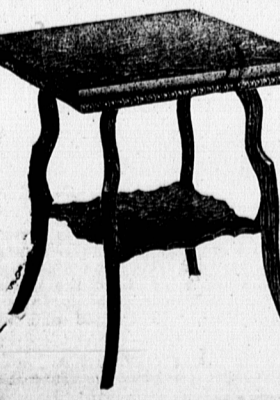

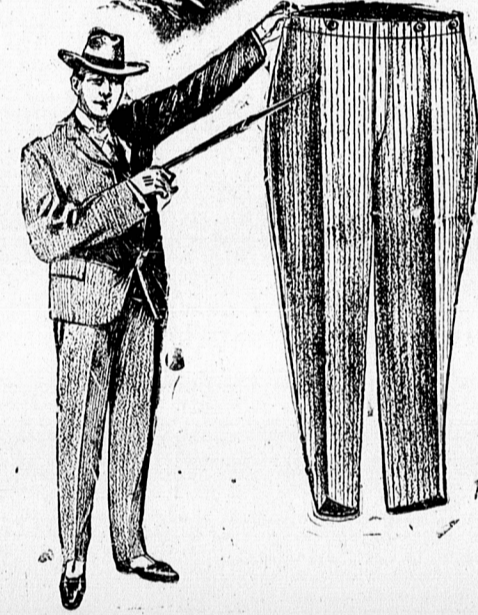

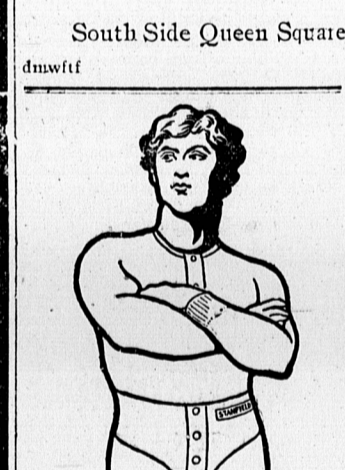
