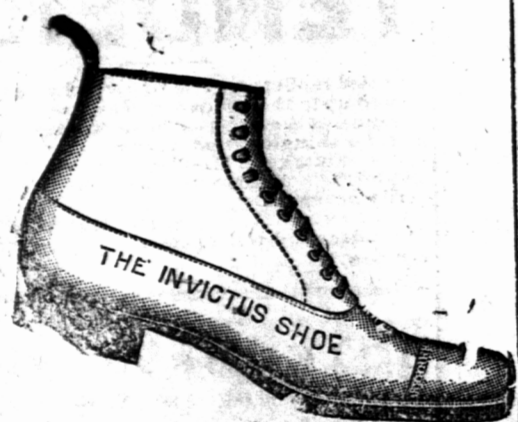
THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY IS IN COMMITTEE OF SUPPLY

There was much rioting owing to the attempt to expel the Redemptorists and several fights between their supporters and opponents.

The troops repeatedly cleared the streets and many persons were injured.

GENERAL MILES' REPORT PUBLIC

Reveals Shocking Cruelties in the Philippines.

Perpetrated by American Soldiers. Natives Died of Torture—Appalling Railway Collision, Killing Eleven.

MILES REPORT MADE PUBLIC. WASHINGTON, April 27.—(Special)—The War Department has made public General Miles' report on the misconduct of officers and soldiers in Philippines.

CRUELTY CHARGES VERIFIED. The General verified many charges of cruel and unhuman treatment of natives by American soldiers and issued orders that all such must stop.

In several instances natives suffered death as the result of the tortures inflicted.

ITALIANS AND GREEKS KILLED. BUFFALO, KANSAS, April 27.—(Special)—The north bound Missouri Pacific crashed into the rear end of a working train last night.

Eleven men were killed and fifteen injured. All were Greek and Italians except Peter Fry, boss on the work train.
