KING'S COUNTY EXHIBITION.

October in Prince Edward Island will open with a blaze of Exhibitions, beginning at Georgetown, followed by Summerside and closing with the large Maritime Exposition in this city. These are not to be regarded as rival fairs, but rather as complementary parts of one concerted movement. Each of these Exhibitions ought to be and we trust will be a stimulus to the others.

We are pleased to note in the prize list of the King's County Exhibition, the generous and numerous prizes in live stock for registered males. As the only way to substantiate the purity of breeding is by registration, this Exhibition demands pure-bred pedigree for males in all classes of domestic animals, poultry only excepted. It is, we believe, a proved fact that four crosses from one registered breed of males produces a progeny of pure bred descendants, and such are accepted by the British Herd Book for registration.

This prize list may do much to strengthen the sentiment now prevailing that pure bred males of improved breeds are most valuable and indispensable in the production of agricultural live stock and will stimulate the demand for such. That demand can only be satisfied by the men who are professional breeders of registered stock and all these will no doubt be found as exhibitors at our Provincial Exhibition. So that the King's County Show, with a prize list such as that before us may be regarded as an important feeder and customer at the Provincial Fair.

It is well known that the prizes offered at the best of our Provincial Exhibitions are no sufficient reward to the professional breeders of registered stock. They must sell their stock and sell it well in order to live. So there is no cause for rivalry between the Provincial and County Exhibitions. This principle if carried out in connection with our Farmer's Institute practice of owning pure bred males, may be expected to result in many districts becoming the strongholds of favored breeds owing to the persistent use of one special breed of registered males for a consecutive number of years. Each of these 1,000 and we hope they will thrive and endure.

So far we have spoken only of the live stock department of the King's County Fair, but we find that in grains, vegetables and fruits the prizes are on a generous scale for a County show and well worth being competed for. And in the housekeeping class the prizes are also numerous, well considered and sufficiently liberal to call forth enthusiastic competition. Fish is a product in which King's County excels, and remembering the important enterprise at Souris, a very interesting exhibit may be expected from that establishment.

The Guardian hopes to record a great success for the King's County Exhibition and that it may draw many visitors from all parts of the island. We also trust that a goodly number may make the entire round of the shows in each County and so inform themselves by ocular inspection of what the East and West as well as the Centre of our Island Province can produce. All so disposed will please remember that the King's County Exhibi-

tion comes first in order of time and will have a variety of features peculiarly its own and of first-class interest.

The anti-Asiatic riots in California and British Columbia are portentous events. Organized white labor has made up its mind not to tolerate a further inflow of the brown men from the East. But both Japan and China are preparing to assert more and more the rights of their citizens to fair treatment wherever they may go. This matter threatens to become very serious before it is finally settled.

We are heartily in accord with The Patriot, and with Messrs Warburton and Prowse in their efforts to have the necessary repairs for the Government steamers Minto, Stanley and Brant, made at this port, that Island labor may have the benefit that is justly due. But if in that as in some other matters the Government refuses us justice, what can we do? We must just "grin and bear it."

Julius Scriver, a well-known and prominent Liberal of the old school, died in Montreal September 5th in his 82nd year. Mr Scriver was from the date of the union down to 1900 the representative of Huntington County, first in the Quebec Legislature, and from 1869 in the House of Commons. He was respected by both parties as a moderate, patriotic man of high character. Owing to ill health he retired from public life in 1900.

The attempt to construct a cantilever bridge with 1800 feet span is really a much more serious undertaking than to bore a Tunnel under Northumberland Straits. A single span of such length was never before attempted, but there are many Tunnels of greater length than the distance between Traverse and Tormentine, and few if any of them through rock or material so favorable for excavation and Tunnel work.

The Toronto Globe speaks of the Georgian Bay Canal as an important work which will be some day constructed by denies that the demand for it is urgent. It also informs Mr. Perks, who is actively promoting the scheme, that if he is an applicant for a Government guarantee of a hundred millions to construct the work "he will have to wait for it." This may be taken to indicate that the Georgian Bay project is not to be a great factor in the next election. In the meantime there is another project which is both important and urgent in which all the three eastern Provinces are deeply concerned—the Tunnel. And it will not cost a cent.

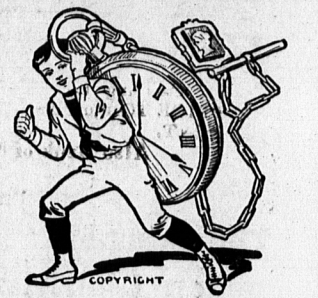
