### MORE PENSIONS FOR VETERANS' WIDOWS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 30—Widows of deceased soldiers and sailors of the Civil War in instances where the marriages occurred since June 27, 1890, are to be pensioned under the provisions of a Bill favorably reported to the Senate today from the Committee on Pensions. Under the existing law widows are not pensionable unless their marriages took place prior to the date mentioned.

It is estimated by the Pension Bureau that there are about fifteen thousand such widows who would be benefited by the passage of this law. Last year there were between nine thousand and ten thousand deaths among widows of soldiers and sailors, and, therefore, it is argued in support of the measure that the annual pension budget would not be increased materially.

The report of the Committee said it cannot be assumed that these widows who married since June 27, 1890, were influenced by mercenary reasons as under the existing laws they had no pensionable status. Opponents of the measure point out, however, that the Bill furnishes a reason for designing women to seek out aged soldiers and marry them, as under its provisions they would be pensionable after the death of their soldier husbands.

### WANT STRONGER PACIFIC FLEET

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Jan. 30.—Nathan C. Coghlan, of San Francisco, introduced a joint resolution recently in the Assembly, calling on the California delegation in Congress to urge the establishment in Pacific waters of a fleet whose war strength shall be as great as that of any other nation on the Pacific. Coghlan's resolution is similar to one introduced by Senator Anthony except that it does not mention the Japanese as one of the people against whom protection is sought.

### CANADA'S CROPS AREA AND VALUE

News of Each Province. Feature in Reports Was Prevalence of Drouth From Midsummer to Winter.

OTTAWA, Jan. 30.—"An area of 27,506,633 acres of field crops has yielded a harvest which, computed at the average local market prices has a value of \$122,534,000.

"The principal grain crops of the country are wheat, oats and barley, which aggregate an area of 16,257,169 acres and in value \$293,370,000; the principal fodder crop is hay and clover which of an area of 8,210,000 acres has a value of \$121,884,000. Live stock, mixed grains and flax grown on 1,255,750 acres, have a value of \$23,641,000; the hood or cultivated crops of beans, potatoes, turnips and other roots, corn and cabbages, grown on 1,471,913 acres, have a value of \$78,536,000."

The above interesting information is conveyed in the December issue of The Census and Statistic Monthly, issued by the Dominion government.

The total value of the wheat harvest in the Northwest Provinces is \$72,424,000 and in the rest of the Dominion \$18,804,000.

The reports of the Provinces are detailed and summarized. A feature in the report is the prevalence of drouth, continuing from midsummer to the setting in of winter and extending from the Rocky Mountains to the Atlantic Ocean. The summaries say—

**PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND.**

What has again suffered from the joint worm. Grain crops are variable in yield and the straw is light. In some cases wheat and oats have rusted. Grain is grown mostly for home consumption. Root crops have turned out well, especially potatoes. The prospects for the winter feeding of live stock are excellent, all correspondents remarking upon the abundance of winter feed.

**NOVA SCOTIA.**

In most districts grain is grown only for home consumption. Field crops appear to have produced up to the average. An exceptionally fine fall yielded root crops and fruit to be gathered under the best conditions. In a large majority of cases correspondents report winter feed either ample or as indicating a surplus at the end of the season. In some districts it is customary to purchase winter feed for dairy cows, and there are a few cases where the surplus is short owing to the effects of drouth.

**NEW BRUNSWICK.**

With the exception of the northern counties, where some scarcity is indicated, the supply of hay is everywhere abundant. Grain crops have given a short yield and more than the usual quantity will have to be imported for feeding purposes. Oats are largely consumed in connection with the lumbering industry, and the shortage is therefore accentuated. Hoots have given a fair average yield and will prove a welcome addition to the winter supplies. Potatoes are an excellent crop.

**QUEBEC.**

The prolonged drouth of the past season has subjected more or less adversely the prospects for the wintering of farm stock. In general there will be sufficient, with no surplus. But in many parts an equilibrium between requirements and supplies has only been effected by the forced sale of live stock in the fall, often a considerable sacrifice. A dearth of water is experienced in some localities, thus adding to the difficulties of wintering stock. Silage or fodder corn, for which the season was particularly favorable, and roots also, where grown successfully, are proving welcome as supplementing the usual supplies.

**ONTARIO.**

The dry weather hindered fall ploughing, and from the same cause the acreage under fall wheat will be less. Where sown, this crop has to a large extent germinated badly, and it presented but a poor appearance at the commencement of winter. As a general rule farmers are well supplied with winter feed, though, except in favored localities, there will be little if any surplus. Many correspondents refer to the value of fodder corn, which proved an excellent crop. Mergolds have also turned out well, but turnips have been universally poor.

**MANITOBA.**

Fine weather facilitated the completion of a large area of fall ploughing. With plenty of well-saved prairie hay, of straw and of grains, there
