KUROKI AND KUROPATKIN.

The Japanese and Russian generals pitted against each other in Manchuria compare in physical stature somewhat as their respective countries do in area. Kuroki is of small size, even for a Japanese, almost a dwarf in height, but good looking, a gentleman of culture and refinement, alert, capable and as cool and observant in battle as on parade. Kuropatkin is a very tall, bony giant.

A Tokio correspondent of the Chicago Tribune tells of a visit paid to Tokio in June last by Gen. Kuropatkin and Gen. Wogack, the latter the Governor of Port Arthur. With an air of condescension and contempt they were looking over the field of their expected future conquests as they hoped and believed. They attended a review of the Guards at Tokio, and one regiment was pointed out to them as having taken part in the storming of Port Arthur in 1894. Kuropatkin replied contemptuously, "Oh! yes. But the Chinese were there then."

Kuropatkin, the correspondent says, called the Japanese "monkeys." The always sneering air of the future conqueror and proprietor was unmistakable. "Never did any one man's look better match his reputation for cruelty, brutality and un pitying bloodthirstiness. It was easy to believe all that was recorded of him in the Turcoman campaign... the butcher of so many thousands, the bayonetter of women and children. He has the heavy face, the slow, sleepy expression of the cruel voluptuary. There was something of the slow creep of a beast of prey, the licking of the chops of the tiger who has tasted and will again taste blood, and his whole scornful progress about the city was a constant irritation to myself and others about the hotel."

**THE ACCIDENT TO THE S. S. HALIFAX**

Boston, June 3.—The steamship *Halifax*, plying between Halifax and Boston, ran ashore near Bug Light Harbor early this morning, and is apparently hung up for the night. She was trying to make the Narrows at the same time that the *White Star Liber Republic* was coming in, and the latter's captain reports that he cheered off twice to let the *Halifax* go ahead, and finally concluded that the *Halifax* intended to let him go ahead. They struck, and the *Halifax* was forced aground.

**NOT ROOM FOR BOTH.**

Boston, June 3.—The steamer *Halifax*, Captain Ellis, from Charlottetown and Halifax, grounded on the south side of Lovell's Island at six o'clock tonight, her bow pointed shoreward and her stern in the channel. The tug *Pallas* will make an effort to float the steamer. The *Halifax* was coming in through the Narrows with the steamer *Republic*, and the accident was apparently due to lack of room for the two vessels. The vessel is in no danger and will probably float without damage. She has less than one hundred passengers on board and a general cargo.

Boston June 3.—The *Halifax* was floated at midnight and docked, Capt Ellis was exonerated from all blame and presented with an address from the passengers.
