Last Tribute Is Paid Noted Sports Figure

BY GAYLE TALBOT Associated Press Staff Writer NEW YORK, Jan. 16 (AP)—Colonel Jacob Ruppert was buried today after his friends and the Roman Catholic Church had paid him moving tribute in a solemn high requiem mass in St. Patrick's Cathedral.

More than 4,000 mourners filled the Cathedral when the casket was placed in a horse-drawn hearse and stood outside in the cold during the service for the fabulously wealthy little brewer and owner of New York Yankees who died last Friday after a long illness.

The mass, sung by a choir of 18 male voices, lasted for nearly an hour, solemn for the most part, but concluding with a majestic and stirring hymn.

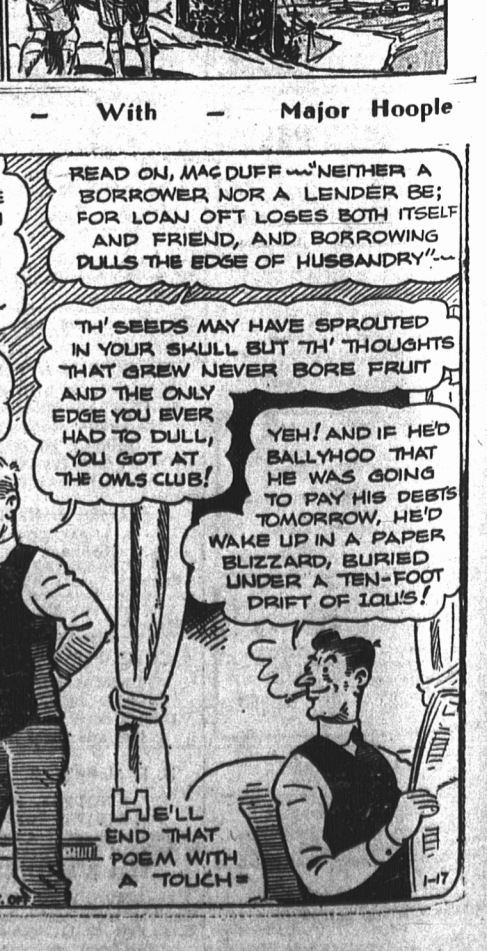
