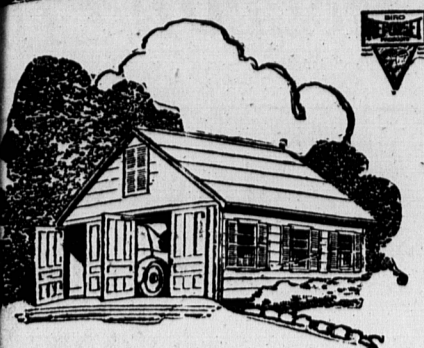

Ninety-one per cent discount on that, but there was no discount on the 150 per cent increase of pay, they took to themselves.

So the Conservative deficit faded out and the Bell government alleged surpluses faded out in the white light of facts and discussion.

The Bell government never had one honest surplus in four years. They faked a surplus by making the Road Debt separate and then claiming a surplus on "ordinary account" as they called it. That was all! The debt mounted up. Interest charges increased by \$10,000!

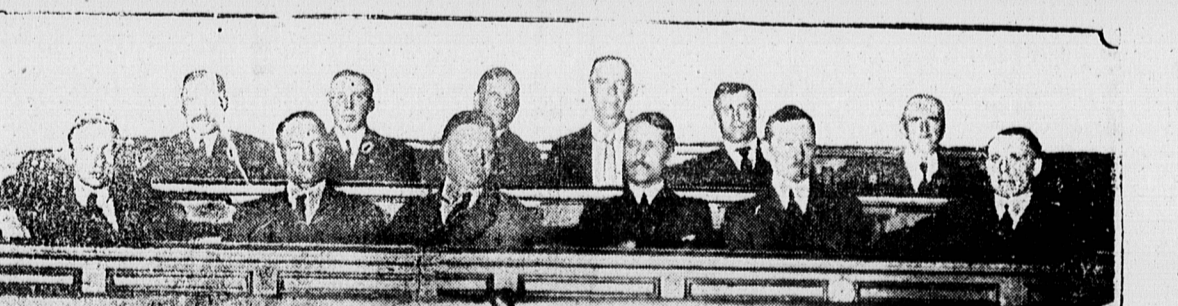
