How Can Infectious Diseases Be Prevented? The most important principle in preventing infectious diseases, whether caused by microbes, parasites, is to avoid introducing into a healthy herd any animal which carries the disease organisms.

On account of the scarcity of certain feeds, it is sure to be a profitable supply of feed on hand. This will give the feed manufacturer the advice to keep your order. He, like the laborer, has shortages of certain ingredients...

Wind Breaks We notice in the press lately where farmers are being advised to plant wind-breaks to shelter their orchards which is certainly good advice.

Regarding protein shortage a complete formula for coping with the problem cannot be stated. The following suggestions containing essential principles which must be observed may serve as a beginning.

1. For the economical utilization of the still available meat and fish supply, the storage facilities on the ranch should be fully utilized.

2. Rough fish such as sucker, carp, sheephead, and other species formerly shunned, must be utilized to the fullest extent.

3. Utilization of dead animal carcasses is already becoming a necessary practice but must be tolerated to some extent during this emergency.

4. It is imperative that a safety test be made on the meat from each carcass. A test unit of four mink or four foxes, depending upon which species will be fed the meat, should be fed a composite meat sample including meat from fore and hind quarters, loin, liver and kidneys for a period of at least two days.

5. Only the rancher himself or one of his experienced and trusted employees should select the dead carcasses to be used. Do not purchase dressed or ground meat that may originate from dead animals from meat vendors.

6. Cleanliness is highly essential in skinning and dressing the carcass. This will improve the keeping qualities of the meat.

7. Prompt skinning and chilling are necessary because meat with the blood in it spoils more rapidly than meat from an animal that has been well bled.

When To Apply Fertilizer and Lime To Pastures (Experimental Farms News) Fertilizing pastures is becoming a common practice particularly in the Maritime Provinces.

Twenty years' experience in pasture fertilization at the Fredericton Station has shown that it is much more difficult to have favorable conditions for applying fertilizer in the early spring.

It is imperative that a safety test be made on the meat from each carcass. Exports of dairy cattle to the United States during the past week totalled 391 head, compared with 252 in the corresponding week of last year.

With the exception of Montreal, where prices were down 25 cents to 50 cents, calves were generally steady to firm sellers.

Don't allow fall pigs to be farrowed in old hog lots or spring litters in filthy pens. Such surroundings are infested with worms and disease germs.

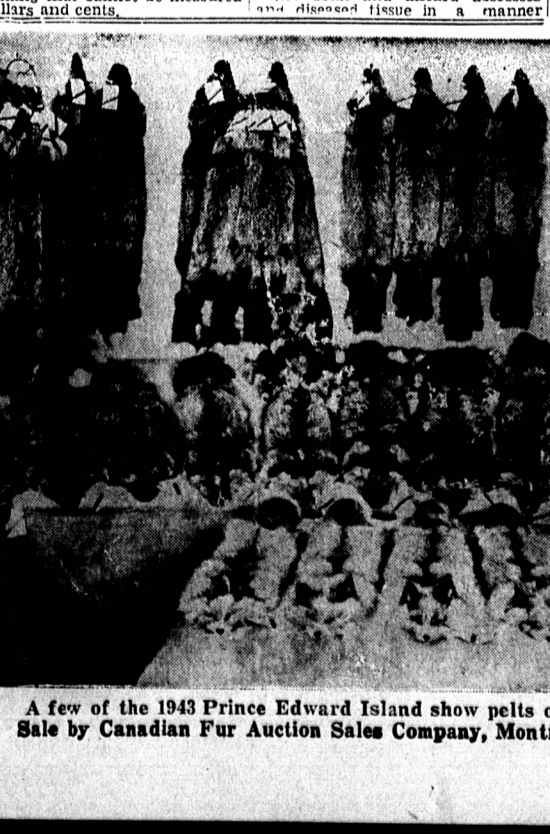
Don't overcrowd poultry houses, it reduces the vitality of the birds and endangers the health of the flock. Do not allow chickens to graze in mud which are continually in poor condition due to neglect and unsanitary surroundings.

Efficiency should be the aim of every poultry producer, particularly so during wartime. This means regularity and system in the care of the flock, as well as greater effort to prevent the waste of feeding stuffs.

Where wheat, oats and barley of good quality are grown on the farm, they can be used as the basis for the poultry ration. The method of a commercial concentrate should supply all the ingredients necessary for a good laying or hatching purpose.

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When To Apply Fertilizer and Lime To Pastures

Fertilizing pastures is becoming a common practice particularly in the Maritime Provinces. Recent pasture investigations at the Dominion Experimental Station, Fredericton, N.B., indicate that fertilizer applied in the early fall is the main, give better results than spring applications.
