CHICAGO, June 26 (AP)—Grain futures followed an upward trend during most of today's trading, with wheat advancing shortly after the opening and holding well to top levels. MONTREAL, June 26 (CP)—Prices were adjusted downward on the average trading today on the Stock Exchange and Curb Market, all groups in the indices taking a tumble. Resistance was offered by the reactionary trends by selected groups of metals and liquors. WINNIPEG, June 26 (CP)—A large export business was recorded on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange with the United Kingdom taking more than 3,000,000 bushels of Canadian wheat longer in buyers also made purchases of Canadian oats estimated at 400,000 bushels. NEW YORK, June 26 (AP)—Assorted Stock Market favorites continued to touch best levels for the past eight years or longer in today's proceedings although selling put many recent leaders in the minus column. The Associated Press 60-stock average was up of a point at 68.2, a top since August 19, 1937. The utility composite added 3 at 47, a high since March 31, 1937. TORONTO, June 26 (CP)—Industrial stocks moved back up to their high mark for recent years in today's Toronto Exchange trading, posting an index gain of 33. Other groups sold down, Western Oil losing 90, the golds 56 and the Base Metals 55. The tone of the market was improving in the final stages. Aggregate turnover of 1,396,000 shares was the heaviest in more than two weeks. Weakness was general in the junior gold list and some of the secondary issues sold off moderately while the seniors were steady. Done and Hollings firming narrowly and Lake Shore lost 1-2. Losses 10 to 15 cents were netted by Bear, Cochenour Williams, Condon, Deimling, Chesterfield, East Sullivan, O'Brien, Quimont, Preston, San Antonio, Sullivan and Trans-Resources.
