There were 2,000 bags of oats and 200 dressed hogs among the shipments of the Empress from Summerside yesterday.

Word was received in Summerside yesterday afternoon that the steamer Empress had arrived at P. du Chenne and would leave there in the morning for Charlottetown direct.

This work includes all the fires in order to haul the large reel containing the extrahose. Wednesday morning when the alarm was rung in, the contractor did not appear on the scene. On return to the engine house enquiry was made why the hose was not hauled down and it was discovered that the contractor had never heard the bell or if he did not respond. It is the opinion of a good many of the prominent citizens that a big mistake was made by the council in doing away with this department, and the sooner the town decides to buy another pair of horses and attend to their own work the better satisfied will be the citizens.

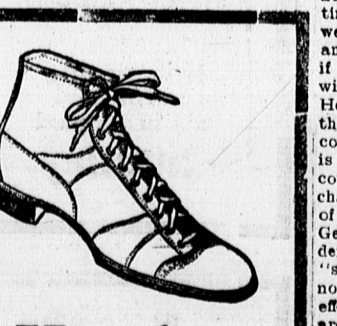
