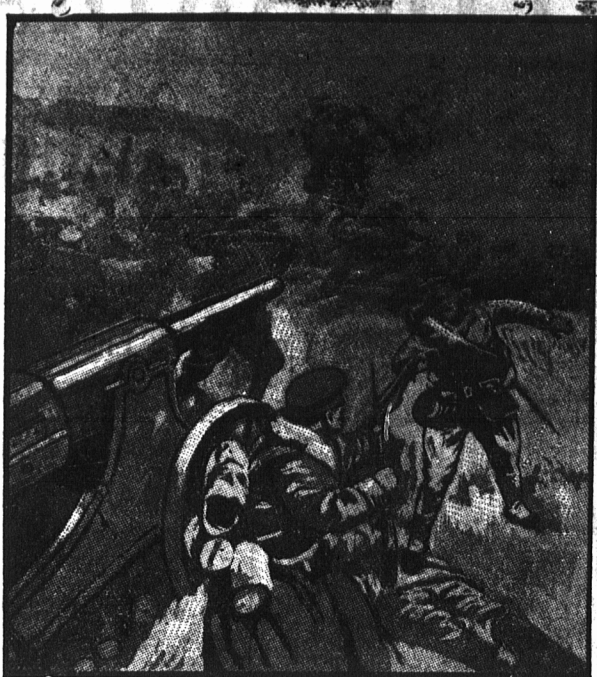

The Chimney Swift.
 One of the popular errors concerning the chimney swift is the belief that it is a swallow, and it is called the chimney swallow by nine-tenths of the people. As a matter of fact, however, it is not even closely related to the swallows, being much more nearly akin to the humming birds and the goat-suckers. Like birds of the latter class, swifts feed on insects which they capture on the wing. Their powers of flight are marvelous, while on foot they are practically helpless. Their wings have been developed to a wonderful degree, but their feet, through disuse, have become weak and quite useless for purposes of locomotion. Their toe nails are sharp, however, and enable them to cling securely to the inside of a chimney, and when, for any reason, a nest gives way and falls down, as it often does, the young birds, if not too small, scramble up to the top of the chimney to be fed by their parents until they are able to shift for themselves.

Eastern Funeral Rites.
 Some curious details have just reached Paris concerning the funeral ceremonies of Norodom, the late king of Cambodia. Immediately after death the body was placed on a bed of state, while cannon boomed to warn the populace to shave their heads. Next day the body was embalmed, according to ancient custom. The face was covered with a gold mask studded with diamonds and other precious stones. On the head was placed the ancient crown, and even the slippers on the feet glistened with rare jewels. Then the body was placed in a kneeling posture and incased in an upright sheath of gold and was sealed up in a massive casket of solid gold. Thus it will remain in the throne room, with bonzes praying night and day until the completion of the sanctuary in which the body will be cremated. Only after this ceremony will the new king be crowned.—London Globe.

Plants in Treating the Sick.
 "Growing plants, and especially odoriferous flowering plants, are of the greatest value in the treatment of the sick," said Dr. Frances Bartlett. "As long as the plants are kept moist they will diffuse moisture, and they undoubtedly have the power to produce ozone. Some plants will vaporize the atmosphere to the amount of three times their own weight in a day. In this way the atmosphere of a sick-room can be made of the greatest benefit. The only dangerous plants to place in a sick-room are those which give off unpleasant odors. Why send consumptives to Colorado to benefit by the climate when we can bring that climate into their homes by the simple expedient of having growing plants in their rooms? Care should be exercised in regard to cut flowers. They should not be left in the rooms at night. They throw off carbon dioxide, but during the daytime the amount of oxygen they produce neutralizes the harmful effects."

It Certainly Was Odd.
 The Duke of Roxburghe has in his castle at Kelso a number of fine family portraits. Some of the rooms at Kelso are thrown open to the public on certain days. The Duke sometimes tells of a remark that he once heard a stranger make while looking through these rooms.

The stranger had halted beneath two paintings that hung side by side. They were portraits of the third Duke and his son, but the father had been painted in his childhood, the son in his old age.

It was this that perplexed the stranger. He studied the portrait a long time. Then he said: "Is it possible that this gentleman was an old man when his father was born?"

A Novel Night Clock.
 A novel night clock of Professor Firth of Munich contains an electric lamp which lights up when a button is pressed and which throws an enlarged shadow of the dial upon the ceiling. Though the shadow has the size of a church clock the greatly magnified hands and figures are sharp and distinct.
