Annual Field Days Held Successfully At Five Stations

Five of the annual Field Days on the Prince Edward Island Illustration Stations, under the leadership of L. M. Cassery, have been held with a total attendance of almost one thousand farmers. These events were held at Iona, Alliston, New London, Rustico and Rose Valley. With ideal weather conditions and a heavy crop of excellent quality stored, the farmers welcomed these events.

Among the focal points of interest on the field tours were the plant food deficiency studies in which a number of fertilizer treatments are applied to the main crop and the immediate residual effect is studied during the entire rotation. In studying the crops on potash or nitrogen did not produce good crops without the addition of superphosphate. A very apparent improvement was noted where applications of barnyard manure were applied either alone or in conjunction with chemical fertilizer. The feasibility of using supplementary fertilizers on the main crop was a live topic of interest. At Rustico, 300 pounds of (3-15-8) benefited the crop. However, the same application on the light soil of Iona and Alliston resulted only in very slight improvement. However, the use of supplementary nitrogen content of the fertilizer to the equivalent of a (5-15-6), 300 pounds resulted in a decided improvement.

Cereal Plots

The cereal varietal plots were carefully studied and Mr. MacLaren, Cassery, answered many questions. The newly licensed oat variety, Beaver, a stem and leaf rust resistant variety, was on display with two other strains of the same cross, looking even more promising. The use of drill width seeder strips designed to test promising varieties under field conditions was of considerable interest.

At Alliston lupins again showed to advantage in being able to thrive under very difficult conditions and provide a good green manure crop. The use of supplementary nitrogenous applications to the timothy crop clearly was useful in increasing yield of timothy seed.

One very satisfactory project was the changing-over of the sloping hillside on the New Lennox Station permanent pasture. The pasture had heavy coverage and provides splendid protection against further erosion.

Soil Erosion

Dr. J. A. Clark, addressing the meeting, complained the operators and the supervisor on the work being accomplished, explaining that the soil erosion could make similar progress provided they attacked their problems correctly. Discussing farm management, he stressed the damage caused by soil erosion, he believed, also that wild rubbish could be controlled by simple, easy cultivation of crop rotation and summer fallow. He had reason to believe, he stated, that the farmer would have the services of a winter or spring service.

Mr. Stewart, in dealing with hogs and sheep, noted that hog production generally down in Canada was up in Prince Edward Island. The British market would continue to be important and this requires quality and continuity of product. This has been achieved but to hold it hog breeders must watch selection of breeding animals. Essential factors to be watched include body conformation, bone development and smoothness.

Mr. Stewart, speaking at Rustico, stressed similar requirements. A point emphasized was the necessity of having a continuous number of good breeding animals could be secured.

Soil Survey

Mr. George Whiteside, soil specialist, gave a brief summary of the work already accomplished by the soil survey in Prince Edward Island. He has found that while a large percentage of our soils are agriculturally suited, a satisfactory level of soil fertility is difficult to maintain. The organic matter content of our soils is low and the tendency towards soil acidity. Soil erosion and leaching are two important factors assisting with low fertility. He stressed the necessity of good grass coverage to halt erosion and the judicious use of ground limestone. He also emphasized the need of soil management practices designed to increase the humus in our soils.

Mr. Frazer, who very attentively listened to as he discussed the various aspects of poultry management and then dealt with the possibilities of shipping hatching eggs to the "Delmarva" district where there exists an unlimited year-round market for quality, disease-free P. E. I. hatching eggs.

Blight Control

Mr. Lorne Calbeck, dealing with the problem of blight control, stressed the necessity of prevention. This included destroying refuse piles of potatoes as possible sources of infection, the use of disease-free seed, and the indispensability of spraying early and obtaining proper coverage of the plants. The use of the (8-4-80) Bordeaux Mixture was giving an improved control, the foliage was being burned and the presence of mosaic was not marked. It was becoming apparent that the system
