Fate Of Stalingrad Grows More Critical Hourly

Entire Family Dead As Result Of Accident

Three persons, an entire family, died as a result of the level crossing accident at Bedford Station Tuesday morning. Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Rice both succumbed yesterday afternoon to injuries received when the coupe car in which they were driving was hit by the eastern train near their home the previous day. Their two-year-old son Jackie died several hours after the accident.

Alcohol Type Anti-Freeze Only

OTTAWA, Sept. 2—(CP)—Passenger car and truck owners will be allowed sufficient alcohol for their radiators this winter, but all types of anti-freeze for use in trucks, motorcycles, and passenger cars. A previous order banned the use of glycerine as anti-freeze for motor vehicles.

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS, Australia, Sept. 3—(Thursday)—(CP)—Allied bombers of Gen. MacArthur's command made a heavy attack on the Japanese airbase at Buna, at the northern tip of the Solomon Islands, in a night raid last night, unleashing five tons of bombs along the runway and upon enemy installations, it was announced today. A Japanese destroyer was hit in the attack, but results were not learned immediately.

Premier Replies To Temperance Federation
