OVEN FRIED SALMON STEAKS
Select thick steaks of salmon. Coat with ~~dry~~ bread crumbs that have been seasoned with salt and pepper. Then dip the fish in beaten egg that has been diluted somewhat with water (beat 1 egg with 1 tablespoon water). Dip again in seasoned crumbs and coat thoroughly with these. Now dot the fish generously with butter and bake in a very hot oven (475 to 500 deg. F.) until the fish is done. It will require about 10 minutes' baking for each inch thickness of fish. Beat the fish frequently during the baking with melted fat. Garnish with lemon slices and parsley for serving.

In memory of Ptl. William "Scotty" Weatherie, killed in action at Xautin, Germany, 22 March, 1945, age 18 years. Enlisted January 26, 1944. Trained in Canada four months, then proceeded overseas. He was in England only nine days before landing in France with the Royal Regiment of Canada. Was wounded at Xautin on August 12th, sent back to England where he was in hospital and recovering home until returning to England in February. Memorial Mass was held in his honor on March 25th in the Holy Trinity Church.

He was buried in a small military cemetery very near the spot where he was hit. A burial service was conducted by the Padre of one of the other Battalions of our Brigade our own Padre being away at the time. You have good cause to be proud of your son Bill, Mrs. Weatherie. We who were with him are proud of him. He died bravely like the best chap he was. The other members of his platoon will miss him very much and would like me to convey to you their sympathy and admiration for Bill. He was a very popular member of the platoon. He has conducted a large part in helping to bring victory and a hope of future happiness to thousands of unknown people as well as to our own country.
