THE GUARDIAN has received from Messrs. Geo. Carter & Co., a colored map of South Africa. The map can be had by any person who may purchase goods to the amount of 50 cents and upwards.

It is now definitely announced that the steamer Glencoe, which has been built for Messrs. Reid, will perform a regular weekly service between Halifax and St. John's; she has been built to the order of Messrs. Reid, of the Nfld. Ry. and S. S. system, and will be operated at Halifax by the Plant Line, it being understood that the Plant people and the Nfld. people have consummated an important steamship arrangement whereby both these cooperations will be identified with the development of traffic from Newfoundland. The advantage of having a regular weekly connection between Halifax and St. John's will no doubt be appreciated by the public. A cablegram to Mr. H. L. Chipman, Supt. Plant Line, announces the very satisfactory trial trip of this steamer and of the departure for this side. She will be due in Halifax at the end of the month, and will immediately thereafter commence the winter service, leaving Plant Line wharf, Halifax, every Tuesday 4 p. m. and St. John's every Saturday 1 p. m. The Glencoe is built of steel; tonnage, 1100 tons; length, 220 feet; breadth, 30 feet; speed, 12 knots. She is built on the most modern plan, fitted throughout with electricity, and fittings are of elaborate kind. Her staterooms are large and airy. She has a very handsome dining saloon, and this saloon, together with her staterooms, are situated amidships. She has accommodation for 117 passengers, and on her main deck is situated a roomy smoking room. She is in every way up-to-date, and has everything that money could buy, and is claimed that she will be without doubt the finest steamer of her size on this side of the water. She is built particularly to contend with the ice of Nfld. coast, and it is confidently expected she will be able to perform a prompt and reliable service between St. John and Halifax. — Hx Record.
