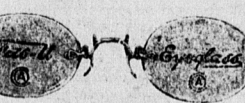

## Berlinquette Is Laid Up With Knee

MONTREAL, Jan. 13.—With Berlinquette laid up with a bad knee, the result of Saturday's game, the Canadiens will be in bad shape for next Wednesday's match unless Broadbent reports for duty on that night. Manager George Kennedy states Broadbent excused himself from participating in Saturday's match on the ground that his employer could not dispense with his services over the week-end. He promises, however, to turn up at Ottawa for the game then. Mr. Kennedy is also dickering with a new youngster, whose name is withheld for the present.

## Maritime Hockey Players Have Chance

National Hockey League Managers Have Scouts Looking Over Material

MONTREAL, Jan. 13.—George Kennedy, managing director of the Canadiens' team in the National Hockey League, is scouring the country for new material. This method is not expected to yield immediate results but if he can get a line on some good youngster now, he thinks they will help for next year. He has kept in touch not only with likely amateurs in Ontario, but also with several men from the Maritime Provinces who have been recommending certain promising players in that part of the country. Mr. Kennedy is confident there is plenty of good material to pick from in the lower provinces.

## CLAIMS GOLD BASIS WOULD TAKE SHADOW OFF CANADA'S TRADE

WINNIPEG, Jan. 13.—Return to a gold basis in currency was the policy urged by Hon. Edward S. Wood, provincial treasurer, speaking on the financial situation in Canada, before a luncheon of the Western Canada Fruit Jobbers' Association here today. "Today Canada is under a cloud," said Mr. Wood, "and why?—on the greatest elements entering into it is the fact that we do not have a legal basis. Until the gold basis is restored, Canada cannot look the world in the face and until that is done the value of the Canadian dollar in the United States will be the actual value of our dollar," he said.

LONDON, Jan. 13.—Negotiations are in process between the Canadian Trade and Commerce Department and Roumanian officials in Paris regarding the non-payment of interest of the twenty-five-million-dollar trade credit extended to the Balkan country by the Canadian Government a year and one-half ago. Sir George Foster took the matter up when he was in Paris and it was proposed that security be furnished by the Roumanian Government for the interest arrears. It is quite definite that Canada can hope for nothing in the way of ready cash at present.

The Roumanian credit is the only one of the five which were granted which is in this unsatisfactory position. The French and Belgian commitments were liquidated almost automatically, while the Greek Government has also lived up to its agreement.

OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—Thrill followed thrill throughout the entire sixty minutes of play at the Arena here tonight when the Ottawa Senators, leaders in the honors in the first half of the National Hockey League hockey schedule, defeated their old rivals, the Canadiens, by a score of 2 to 0.

## Stewart One Of Stars St. Patrick's - Hamilton Game

Amherst Player Made Good in His First Game in the Upper Province Big League

HAMILTON, Ont., Jan. 13.—St. Patrick's, of Toronto, scored another victory over Hamilton here tonight, in the roughest game yet staged in the new arena. The score, four to two, was not a fair indication of the night's play, for Hamilton forward division out-skated and outplayed the Toronto forwards but the great work of the St. Patrick's defense with Forbes in goal giving a wonderful exhibition made it possible for the Saints to win.

Both of Hamilton's goals were scored by Joe Malone, who has tallied all the goals made by Hamilton on the home ice since he joined the team last week. Of the visitors, Stewart, the Mar. 1916 Province player, who made his first appearance in St. Patrick's uniform, was one of the stars. He played on the defense with Cameron and made several spectacular rushes during the night.

## "Blue Law" Leader If After Dempsey

Invokes Ancient Statute to Stop Fight Pictures From Being Shown

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13.—Dr. Wilbur Fisk Crafts will inaugurate his 71st birthday by challenging Jack Dempsey. The high priest of the blue-law apostles isn't going to offer to put on the mitts with the heavyweight champion of the world. He merely wants to curb some of Dempsey's money-making proclivities in connection with the forthcoming discussion with Georges Carpentier.

Dr. Crafts has learned that Dempsey is arranging to profit from the sale of the motion-pictures of his recent encounter with Bill Brennan, and the Sunday reformer is under the impression that Carpentier's antagonist also will try to increase his bank account by selling the films of his set-to with the Frenchman. Today Dr. Crafts "warned" the Department of Justice of Dempsey's activities. He petitioned A. Mitchell Palmer, attorney general, to have his men "on guard" on the ground that it is a violation of the federal laws to transport prize fight pictures out of the state in which they were taken into another state either for publication or exhibition on the screen. The statute which Dr. Crafts thus invokes is an ancient one, he recalls to the Public Ledger bureau tonight, dated back to the days of the 54th Congress. The
