3,000 Seamen Strike
LE HAVRE, France, Aug. 31—(AP)—The entire waterfront at this port was tied up tonight with 3,000 seamen striking in sympathy for one crew which had demanded two extra washrooms in their quarters.
The crew of the French liner Champlain, sailors aboard seven freighters, and all tug-men in the harbor quit work while 2,000 dock workers threatened to join the strike Tuesday.
The strike movement was started after the crew of the small freighter Katiola, owned by the Chargeur Reunis, the third biggest shipping company in France, demanded two additional washrooms to be installed in their quarters.

GOEBBELS TO CONFER WITH HITLER
MUNICH, Germany, Aug. 31—(AP)—Propaganda Minister Goebbels arrived home tonight and was to confer with Chancellor Hitler on what Dino Alfieri had told him about Premier Mussolini's plans for Italy. Alfieri is Il Duce's press minister.
As the plane carrying Goebbels flew over the Italian frontier he wireless Mussolini his satisfaction over "such splendid unanimity of thought and aims between Alfieri and myself."

SUGAR
Raw sugar imports in June amounted to 112,900 tons compared with 115,393 tons a year ago. The consigning countries were as follows: British West Indies 7,471,500, British Guiana 21,254,300, Fiji 8,954,000, British South Africa 2,432,800. Imports of refined sugar, mainly from the United States, amounted to 242,900 tons against 473,600 a year ago, and exports 690,000 tons compared with 562,103. Newfoundland and the United States were the chief purchasers.

the province," he said, "that relations between the present Premier and the retiring Mayor are far from cordial. I should be more harmful than helpful under the circumstances at the city hall."
Premier Duplessis said the Mayor's statement, "will not soon forget me because I correctly predicted that his succession to the Conservative leadership spelled the death of that party in the Province of Quebec, nor will he forgive me because I predict today that his victory in alliance with the nationalist element in this province spells the speedy disappearance of the Province of Quebec from Confederation."
As Mayor of Montreal, said Mr. Houde, he had undertaken to settle economic difficulties and municipal problems. But I had not promised to undertake the rehabilitation of my race.
"Ever since April 1934 there has been growing in the Province of Quebec a spirit of intense nationalism, which complicates the situation gravely, and which is bound to have serious consequences for the French-Canadians in the near future. I have taken no part in a movement I consider dangerous, particularly in a cosmopolitan city like ours.
"Those who are out to fight me belong to that school of thought, and the verdict of the people in the last provincial election makes it plain that the trend is in that direction.
"I leave to those who have undertaken their responsibility for the new orientation of my people, and I feel that I cannot follow them onto ground which leads straight to the secession of Quebec from Confederation.
"Some of the newspapers have been kind enough to find for me employment which is supposed to have influenced me to resign the Mayorship. I declare that I have no position at the present time, that I must look for one immediately, that I leave the city hall poorer than I went in—which is saying a great deal—that my personal position is worse than precarious. Whether or not I am believed does not matter to me."

The East Prince teachers convention was held yesterday in the auditorium of the Summerside High School, and was attended by over 100 delegates. Miss Doris Muncy, President, occupied the chair. Miss MacCarville was secretary. Mr. Elmer Roberts, Kinkora, was elected president for the coming year, Miss Jean Sharp, Long River, vice president and Miss Marjorie MacCallum secretary.

Important matters up for discussion were a two year contract instead of one year between teachers and district, the changing of the school age from 6 to 7, country teachers to correct examination papers for group of schools, each teaching taking one subject, and the importance of training children during school years to meet life's problems.

The convention opened at 10.30 and after the minutes of the previous meeting had been read and passed Mr. Malcolm MacKenzie, of Crapaud, Supervisor of Schools, read a very instructive address dealing with the education of the child so that it could be trained to meet life's problems. His address was entitled "Educating the Child for Successful Living."

Hon. W. D. Euler Back At Desk

(C. P. By Guardian's Special Wire) OTTAWA, Aug. 31—Hon. W. D. Euler, Minister of Trade and Commerce, was back at his desk today after a two months canvass of commercial possibilities in the United Kingdom and on the continent. Tomorrow at a session of cabinet council, he will report to his colleagues in the government.

Mr. Euler visited Russia, Poland, Germany and Holland, and had lengthy discussions with government and business executives in England. While it is believed he brought back little hope of revived trade with Russia, the basis was laid for improved commercial relations with other countries, and information gathered in England that will be vitally important in preparing for revision of the Empire Trade Agreement next year.

Trade policies will be an important feature of discussions with the government before Prime Minister Mackenzie King leaves Sept. 12, for Geneva. It is anticipated, however, that other matters including the numerous appointments to be made, will be taken up first and disposed of at the three cabinet councils scheduled for this week. Commercial and tariff experts of the departments of finance and trade, who have been in England two months, will not be back until next week.

Announcement is expected early this week of the personnel of the Canadian delegation to the League of Nations assembly opening Sept. 21. It is known that the Prime Minister will take Dr. O. D. Skelton, under secretary for external affairs, and is generally believed Hon. Raoul Dandaneau, government leader in the Senate and a veteran of many League meetings, will also be in the party. He has already made two journeys abroad since spring, and only recently returned from his second visit.

Freighter Sinks After Collision With Liner
QUEBEC, Aug. 31—(CP)—The French liner LaFayette pushed slowly through a dense fog tonight on her way here with survivors from the freighter Benmacle which foundered with the loss of one life when the vessels collided early today about 160 miles below Quebec.
