STORY OF ETHEL LE NEVE'S LIFE TOLD BY FATHER

ament. She was, generally speaking, retiring and shy in disposition, but there were times when she would break out into passion.

"When she was only a few years old we removed from Diss to London. By this time her sister Nina had been born eleven months after Ethel, and we went both to a private school. Their progress was not very satisfactory, and we removed them to a boarding school. At night, however, they attended a continuation school and Ethel, in particular, showed remarkable quickness in learning type writing, shorthand, French, German and Latin.

"Ethel was a singularly intelligent girl, and she formed impressions of life which proved that she was wise beyond her years. 'I think if I ever marry,' she said to her mother and myself one day, 'it will be with an old man—a man much older than myself. All the young men I see seem to be so foolish, and to have nothing in their heads but thoughts of dress and amusement.'

"At last the time came when it was necessary to choose some calling in life for the girls, and naturally, we decided to turn their skill at shorthand to advantage. About this time an advertisement appeared for an expert shorthand clerk and typist for the Drouet Institution for the Deaf. I wrote a letter in reply to the advertisement, but did not mention the name of the daughter I wished to obtain the situation for.

"Nina, although younger, was more self-reliant than Ethel, and she begged to be allowed to apply for the place. Consequently, it was Nina, and not Ethel, who obtained the situation. One day the principal told Nina that business was increasing to such an extent that the female staff must be enlarged. She secured the post for her sister. Nina soon got engaged to be married, and when she left Ethel took her place as head of the staff.

As I have said, I had no suspicion of anything being wrong.

"Then one day Ethel electrified us by stating that she had married Dr. Crippen. We were not anxious to know the details, but all she would say that they had driven in a taxicab to a registry office in the West End, that they had been married, and that the ceremony had been witnessed by two of Dr. Crippen's friends.
