BRITAIN IN EGYPT.

The British occupation of Egypt began in 1882, with the crushing of Arabi Pasha's rebellion, which had been the result of the profligacy of the Khedive Ismail. Egypt was in financial chaos. The securities of the state were selling at less than half their face value. The people were saddled with a staggering debt and corruption, dishonesty and confusion was rampant everywhere from the Mediterranean to the Soudan frontier. The British work in Egypt thus began with a struggle against bankruptcy. When success began to appear one reform after another was taken in hand, and the process has been continued through every branch of the public service.
