THE GRAND TRUNK PACIFIC.

The construction of the Transcontinental Railway on the plan proposed was the subject of hot controversy in and out of Parliament when first proposed. The great project has, however, long since passed the controversial stage, and both parties are alike committed to carry it through to completion. For that matter almost the entire length of 1,800 miles between Moncton and Winnipeg—the portion to be built by the Government—is now under contract and sections of it approaching completion.

The most forward link of the Government's part of the work is that between the prairie country and the head of the great lakes—"the spout," as it has been called by which the Northwest grain will be brought to navigable water. Beyond this, across the prairie itself the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company has been pushing forward its line with great energy and last week the section 66 miles in length between Winnipeg and Wainwright was formally opened for passenger and freight traffic.

The importance of this opening to the people along its route can hardly be over-estimated as by this new and direct route their crops of the present year will be brought to Winnipeg and launched on their eastern way to the seaboard and the European market. At the present rate of progress the entire line from Moncton to the Pacific promises to be completed in shorter time than any other work of like magnitude in Canadian history. It will require great activity to have the Mammoth bridge across the St. Lawrence at Quebec ready by the time the portions of the line east and west are completed.

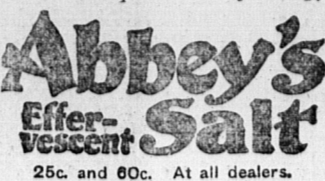
