INWARD TRAINS.--The eastern accommodation arrived in Charlottetown yesterday at 11.05 a. m., on time; the western accommodation at 12.20 p. m., on time and the Summer side at 5.15 on time.

THEY WENT TO CAPTURE.--The young Gentlemen's Hockey Club of Charlottetown which went to Montague Saturday last to achieve fame for their team had poor luck in the hockey line. The boys had a good time otherwise but it is reported they received a defeat to the tune of 2 to 2.

EARL GREY LEAVES.--The Earl Grey left Charlottetown yesterday morning for Pictou with twenty-six tons of freight, twenty passengers, express, and thirty-five sacks of paper and letter mail and docked at 2.15 p. m. She will leave Pictou this morning on return to Charlottetown.

MINTO ARRIVES.--The Minto left Pictou for Charlottetown yesterday morning and got as far as Point Prim, but on account of the heavy ice turned back and went to Georgetown where she arrived at 6.20 p. m. She had on board 20 passengers, 75 sacks paper and letter mail, express and 35 tons freight. She leaves this morning for Pictou.

THE ICE CONDITIONS.--The Earl Grey leaves Pictou this morning for Charlottetown. Captain Taylor informs The Guardian that there is but little ice in the strait and that the difficulty met with yesterday by both steamers was all at the entrance to Charlottetown harbor, driven in by the heavy gales of the previous day. It is hoped that a favorable change of wind will drive this ice out and open up the harbor again for both steamers.

ACCIDENT ON ICE.--The many friends of William Dillon, Market Clerk, Charlottetown, will regret to learn that he met with a very painful accident yesterday on the ice while attending the horse races. He was walking along the ice when an iceberg came from behind and knocked him down. He was dragged for a considerable distance before it could be stopped and a deep cut was inflicted over the left eye. Dr. Ledwell dressed the wound. It would be well if those running ice-boats and driving horses in such crowds as were on the ice yesterday would use a little more judgment in directing their course so that accidents as the above mentioned would not occur.

PEOPLE'S THEATRE.--A very enjoyable program was arranged at the People's Theatre, Charlottetown, last evening. The patrons welcomed the return of two splendid comedies.
