### CONCERNING CLOSURE.

A number of Liberal newspapers are advocating the adoption of the British system of closure in the Canadian Parliament as a means of putting an end to the obstructive tactics of the Opposition now complained of. That staunch Liberal journal the St. John Globe, edited by Senator John V. Ellis, does not share in the belief that closure ought to be adopted, or that if adopted it would prove effectual. The Globe says:

"As a matter of fact, nothing could be introduced which would have that result. Plans introduced into the British parliament a few years ago are often referred to as desirable here, but while the adoption of some of the recent forms of British closure might have some effect in the direction of ending a particular debate it would be quite impossible to frame rules which would put an end to what may be called 'obstruction.' For, as soon as a debate ends upon the question another question may be brought to the front. On each motion that the Speaker do now leave the chair in order to go into committee of the whole on supply a question may be brought forward, an amendment moved, and delaying tactics may proceed.

"As soon as one motion is disposed of, even under the application of closure, another can take its place, or even if there be no other question than the main one that can be discussed, and while debate might be shortened on each occasion it could not be suppressed. The English precedents of late years are often referred to as suggesting forms which might be adopted in Canada. But it is well to remember that cases are not the same in the two countries. The closure was adopted by the British parliament as against the Irish home rulers, and there was little sympathy with the Irish on the part of the two great parties in England. Therefore adoption of the closure was easy, and its enforcement is even now not difficult. In the Canadian House of Commons there are really only two parties, and despite the large majority which Sir Wilfrid has at his command enforcement of any system of closure might increase political bitterness without advancing the public business."

The Globe proceeds to say that the spirit of the west is to rush things while Sir Wilfrid has always pursued the policy of reasonableness and conciliation. We are inclined to the opinion that the trouble at Ottawa will be got over very shortly after the Ontario and Quebec elections are passed. Just now the political world is in a state of great tension not only at Ottawa but east and west of that point. This will pass away in due time, and it would be a mistake to resort to so drastic a measure as the adoption of closure to relieve a merely temporary crisis.

### "THE STANDARD OF EMPIRE."

It is intended to convey to its readers all around the world the principal occurrences throughout the entire British possessions, the news being received by cable in London. Special prominence is given to the news from Canada, Australia, New Zealand, South Africa, India and Newfoundland, while the happenings in all the crown colonies are also reported. The first issue contains twenty-eight pages, and it may be safely said that never before was a newspaper presented to the world containing so full and complete a compendium of the news of all parts of the British Empire in a single issue. The special Canadian cables in the issue before us are from Ottawa, Halifax, Winnipeg, Montreal, Toronto, Edmonton, Vic-

toria, Regina, St. John and other points in the Dominion, and other portions of the Overseas Empire are treated with equal enterprise and liberality.

The tone of The Standard of Empire is thoroughly British and Imperial. Its editorial page discusses the leading topics of interest in the great colonial world, without party bias, but with freedom and force, based on the news supplied by its great staff of well-informed correspondents. In one respect the Standard of Empire is exclusively British, as it will insert no advertisements from any source outside the British Empire. On the other hand the Dominion of Canada, half a dozen or more of the Canadian Provinces, Australia and its various States and the South African Provinces have made it the medium for their official advertisements and announcements. A great advantage must accrue to the British world from an inter-imperial journal of this character having wide circulation in the over-sea dominions and bringing home to the people of the Mother Country the news from distant parts of the Empire. This will be effected by the Standard of Empire being sent as a gratis supplement every week to the entire circulation of the London Daily Standard.

There was for a time some doubt whether Principal Peterson could arrive in time to deliver the promised address before the Canadian Club on Friday next. A telegram from His Honor the Lieutenant Governor now in Nova Scotia, to Percy Pope, President of the Club, tells that by means of a special train the difficulty has been obviated and Principal Peterson will arrive on Thursday evening. There is much interest in the opening function of the Canadian Club in this City.

COPPER AT LAST.
