**Hog Grading Comparisons**

The Dominion Livestock Branch market report in the Guardian issue of Thursday April 29th, aroused our curiosity, particularly that part relating to grading percentages reported on hogs arriving at Charlottetown from different shipping points during the week of April 19th. We looked up our grading records for hogs shipped to Moncton, New Brunswick for the same week, and we find the comparison to be so interesting that we yield to the temptation of placing it before the hog producers of the Province for their enlightenment.

A little pencil work will show that the same number of hogs shipped to Moncton graded 35 per cent more selects than did the hogs delivered to Charlottetown, or in other words, hogs shipped to Moncton netted the shippers \$25.00 per 100 more money than those marketed locally, and that is in premiums alone. In addition to this difference in grading, the average carcass yield on the Moncton hogs was 1.2 per cent on their off car weight. Grading standards throughout the Dominion are uniform in requirements, so that it looks as if the cream of our hogs are being shipped to the mainland.
